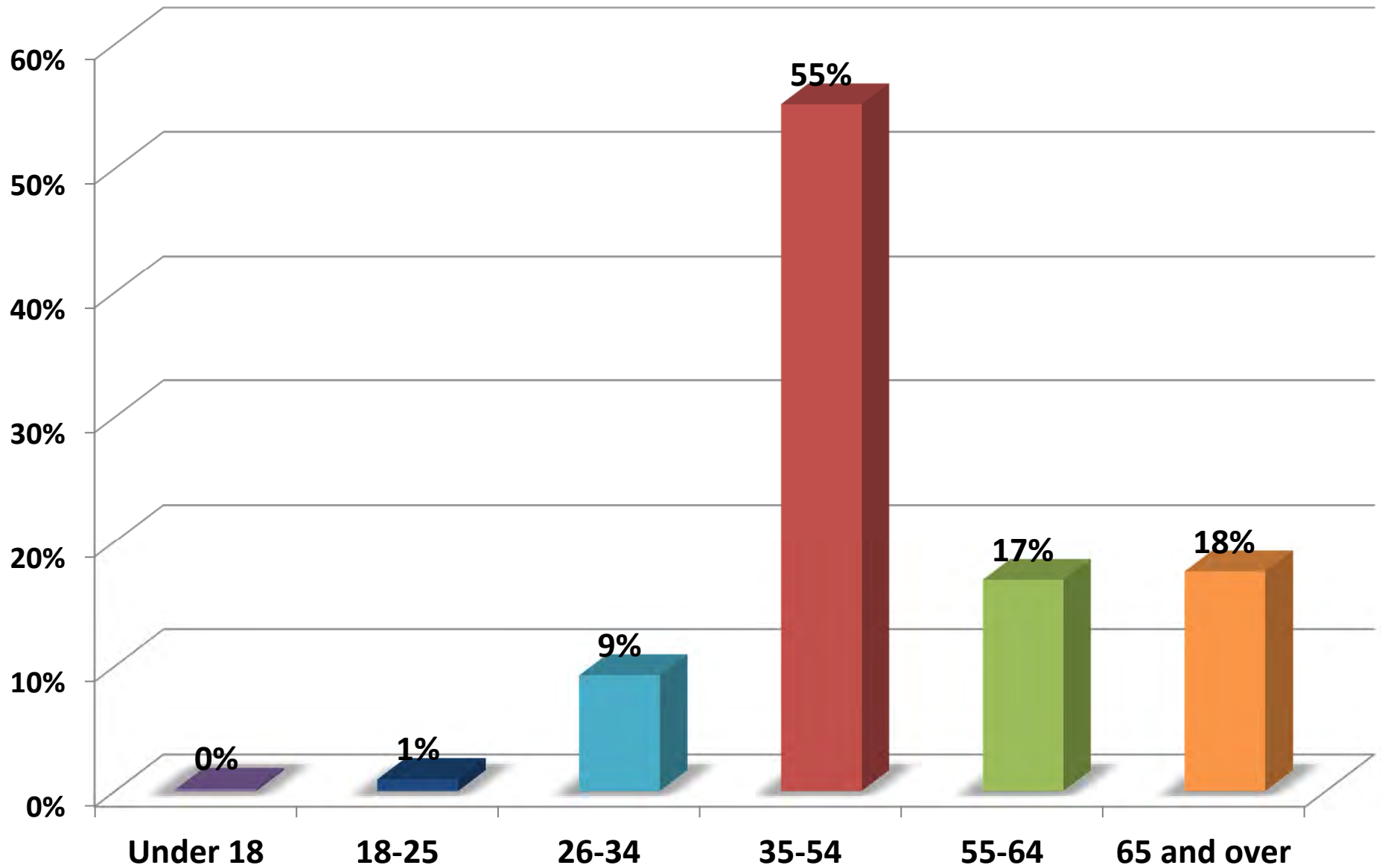

Survey Summary

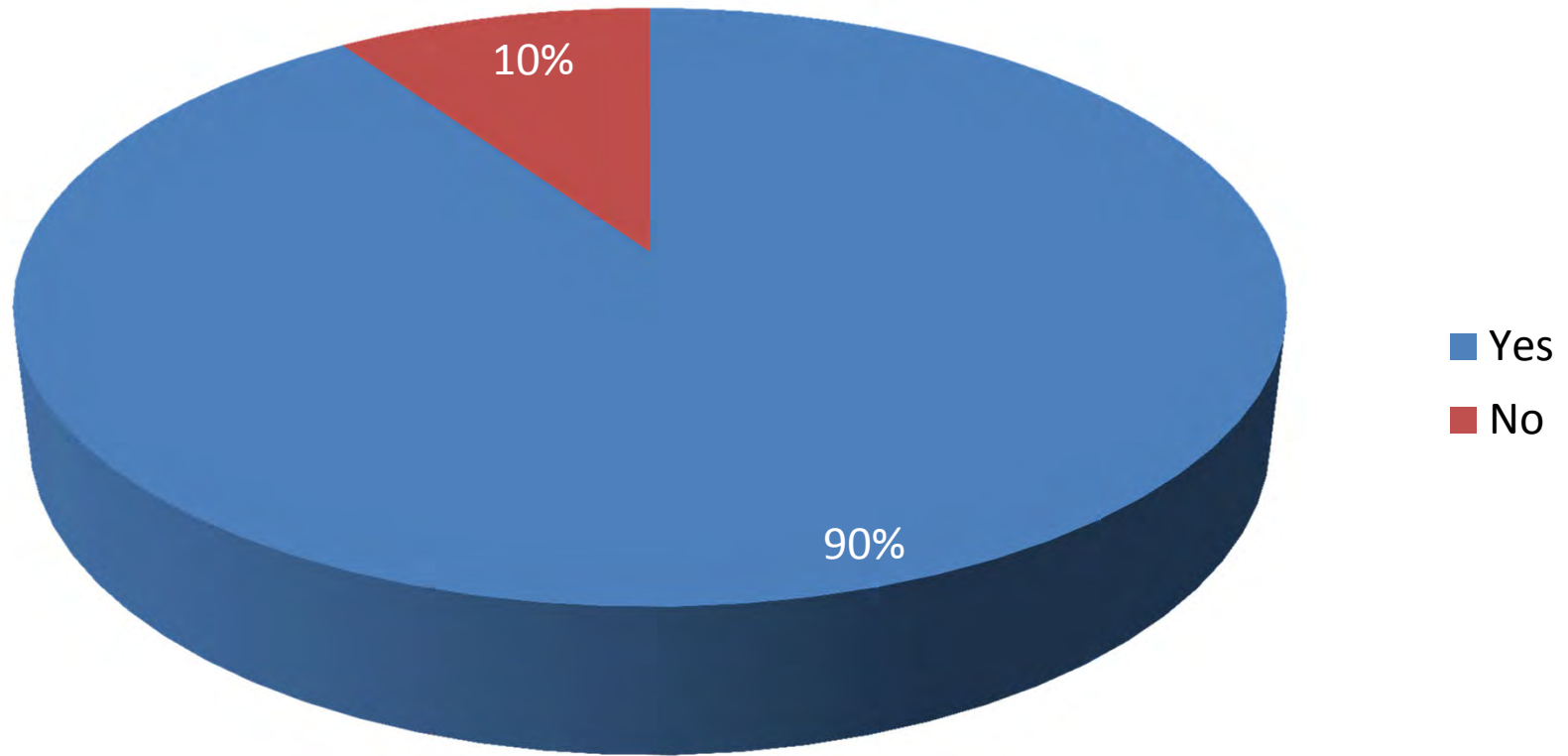
- The community survey was conducted in October of 2015
- Residents within the District were mailed a paper survey. Each survey included a unique survey access code for those who preferred to take the survey online.
- Total responses = 2,908/961 paper (23% response rate)
- Margin of error for the full sample +/- 1.9%

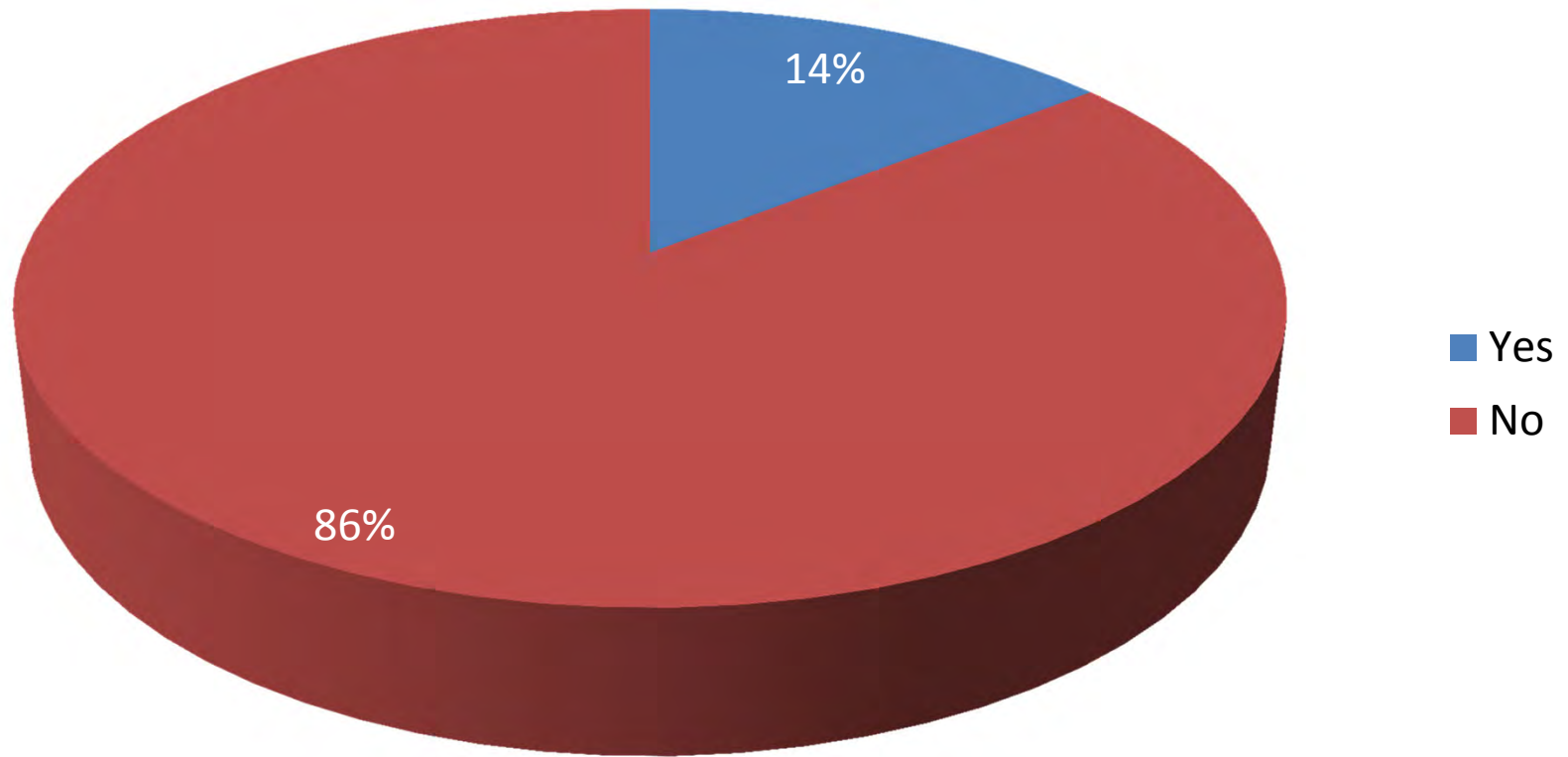
What is your age?



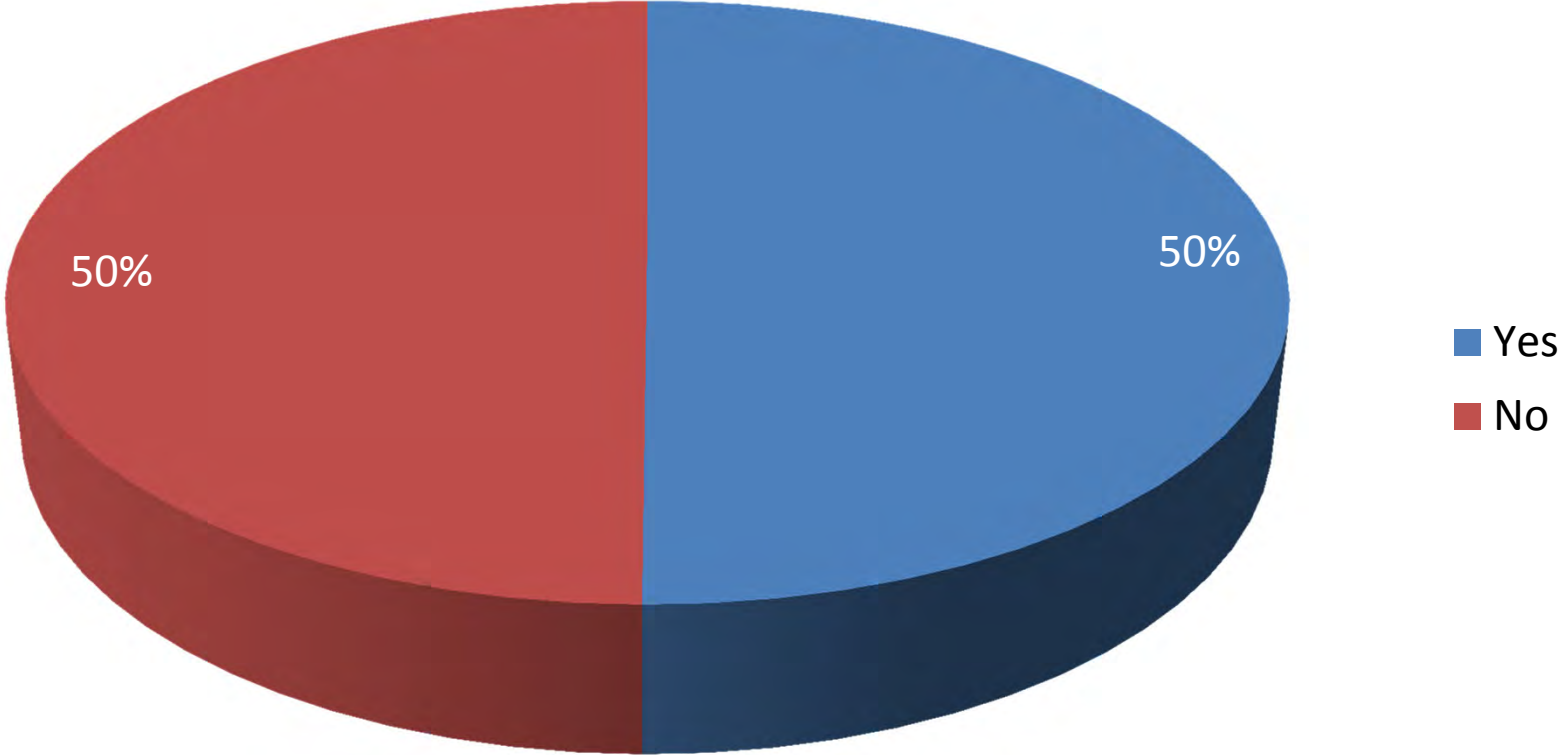
Do you live in the Muskego-Norway School District?



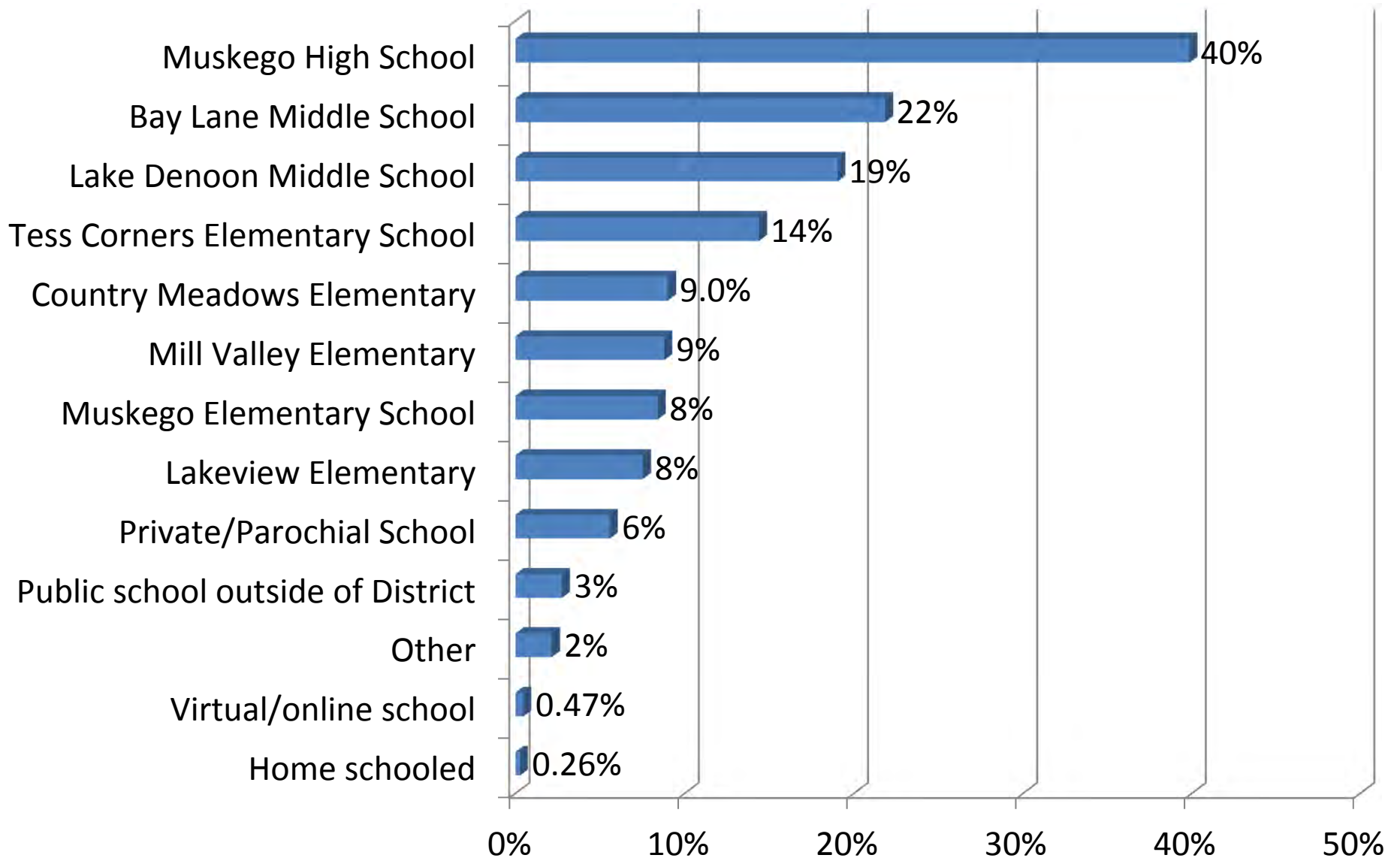
Are you an employee of the Muskego-Norway School District?



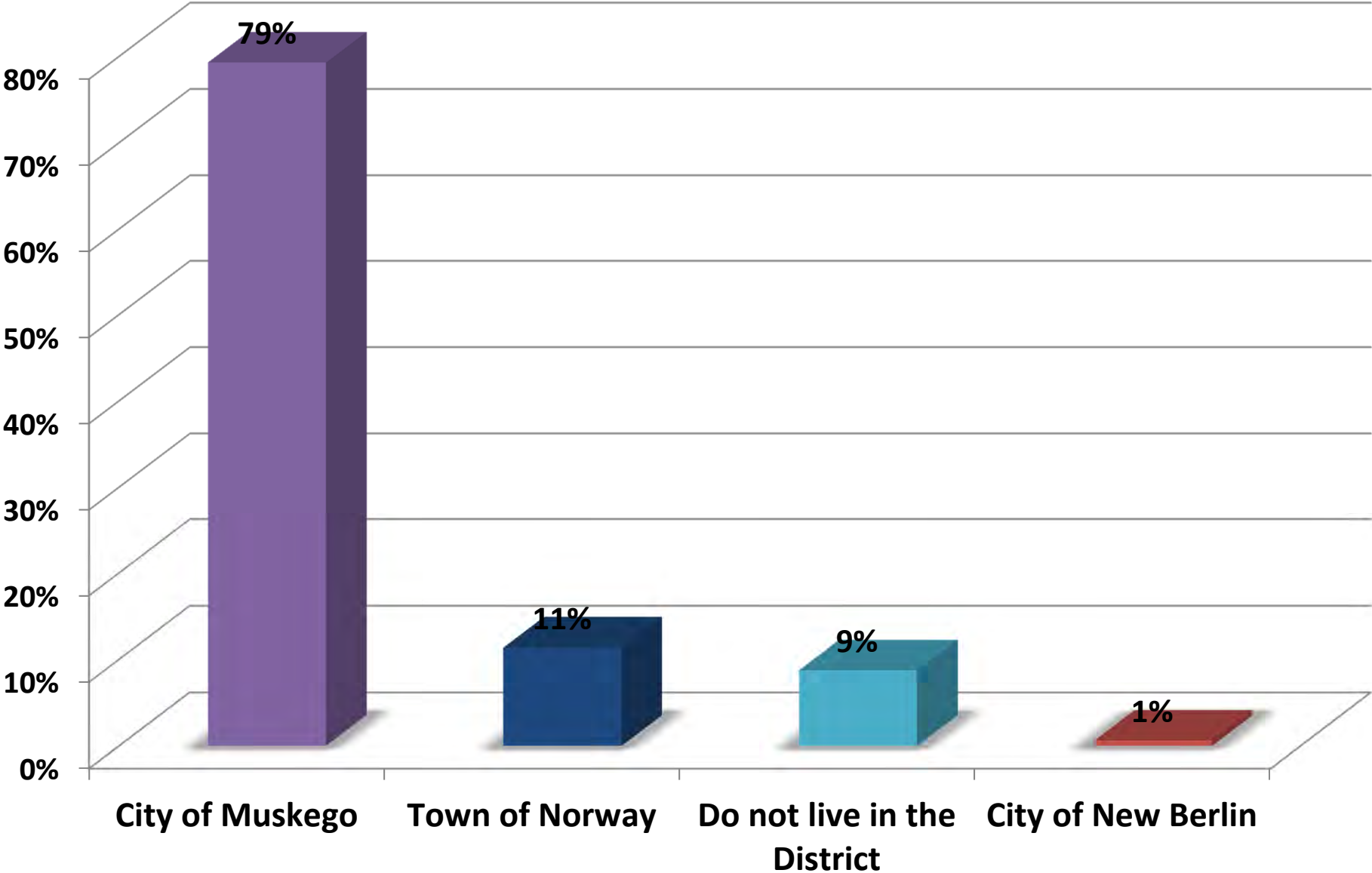
Do you have child(ren) attending the District?



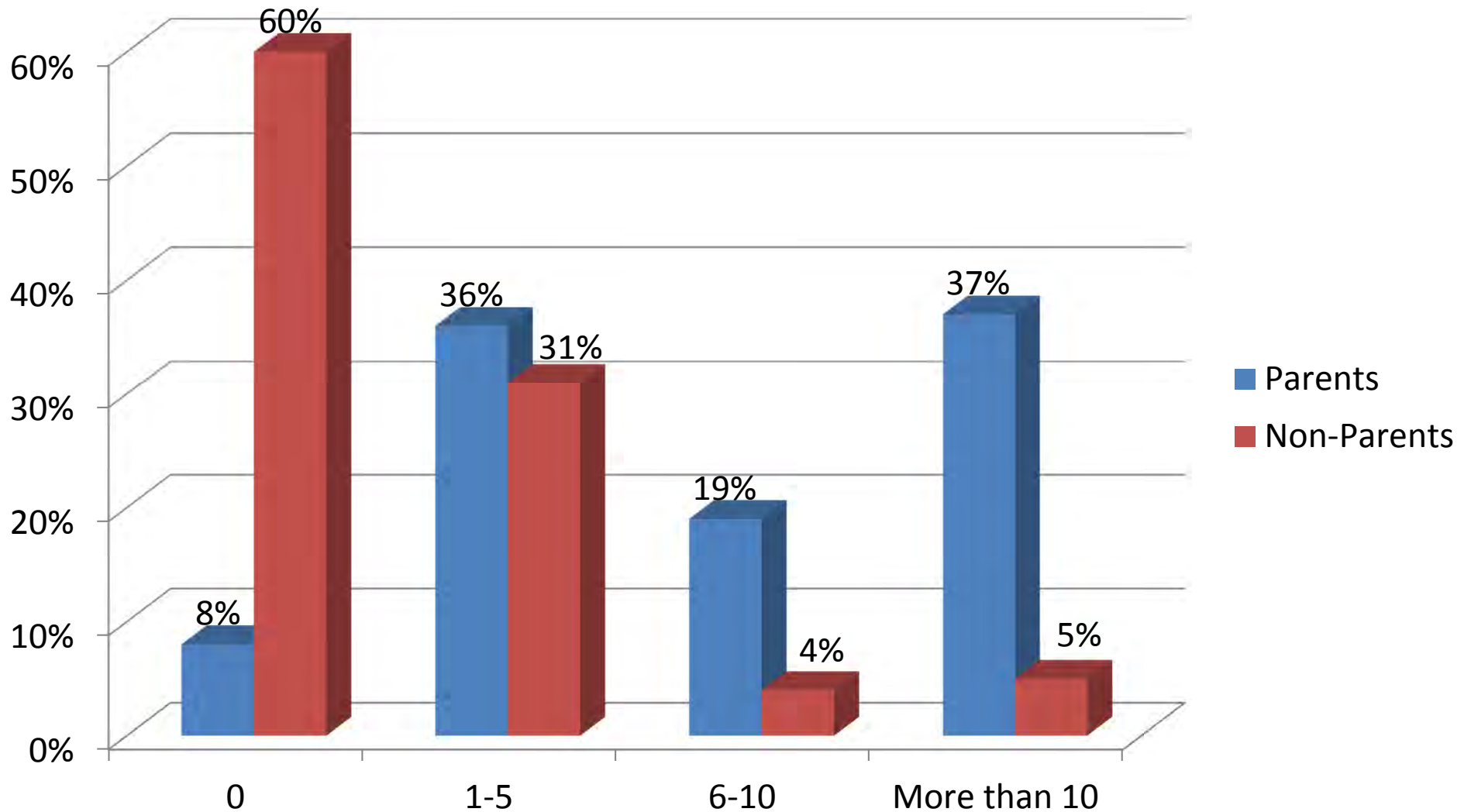
If you have school-aged children, what school(s) do they attend?



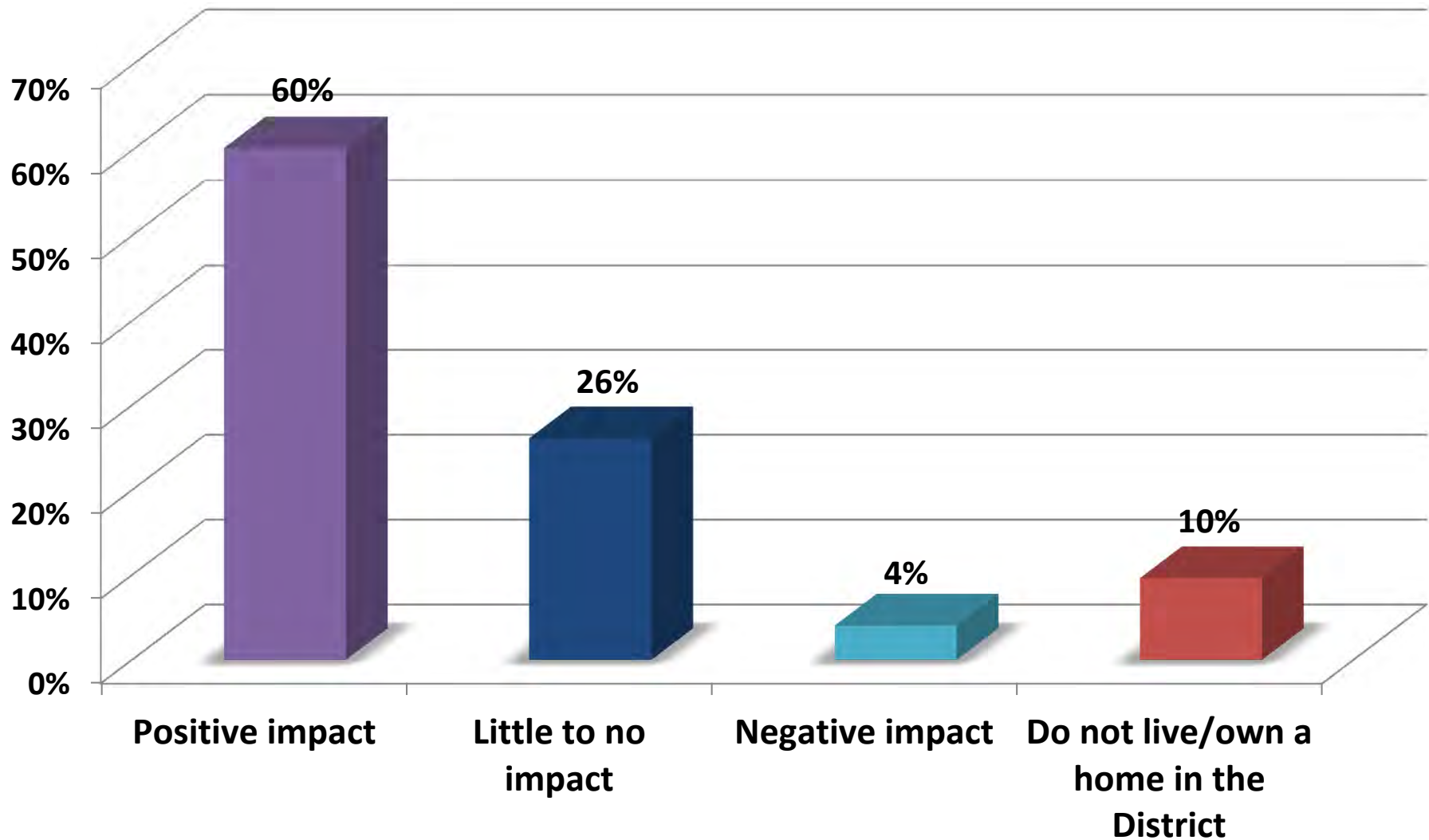
In which city or township do you reside?



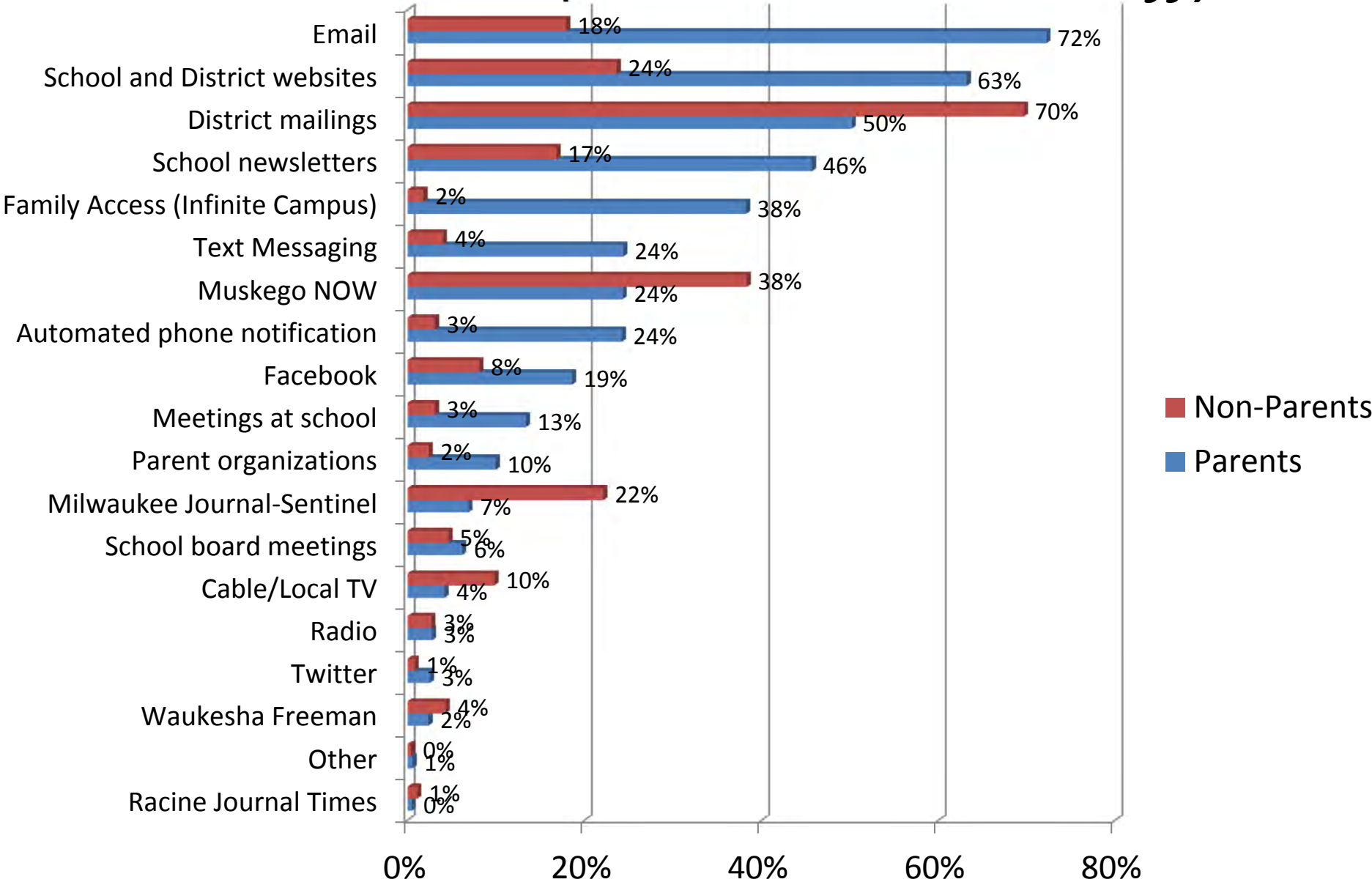
How often have you attended an event at the District (athletics, musical performances etc.) in the past year? *(Does not include staff)*

How would you like to receive school/District information? *(Does not include staff)*

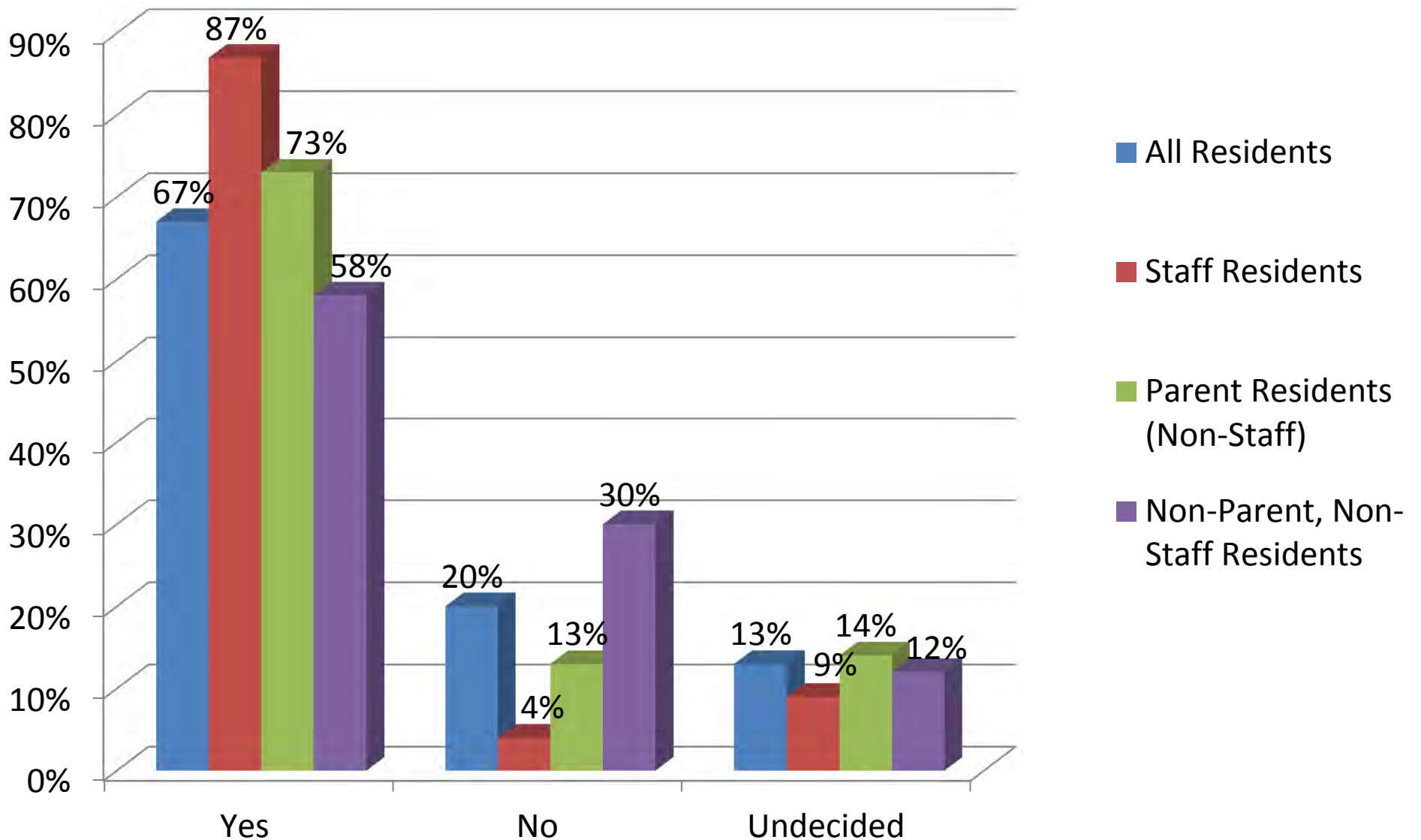


Tess Corners Elementary

- Built in 1924
- Currently serves 463 students in Kindergarten – 4th grade
- Many building components have exceeded their service/useful lifespan
- Does not meet handicap-accessibility requirements
- Aging infrastructure is more expensive to maintain and operate
- Parking lot design and traffic flow creates student safety concerns

Closing/selling Tess Corners Elementary***

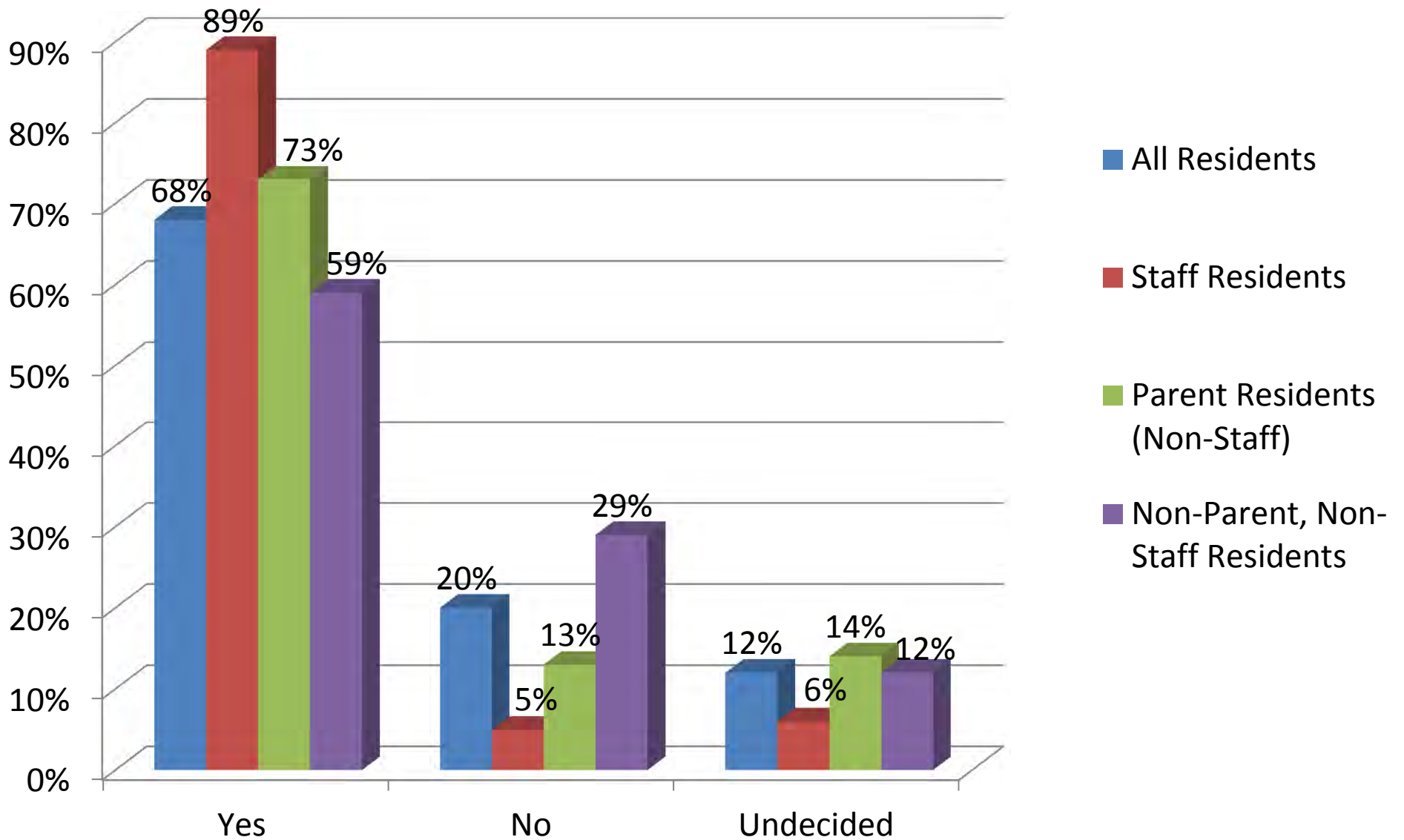


Muskego Elementary

- Built in 1924
- Currently serves 214 students in Kindergarten – 4th grade
- Most building components have exceeded their service/useful lifespan
- This site is 6 acres smaller than the recommended size for an elementary school, resulting in playground space, parking and traffic flow challenges
- Does not meet handicap-accessibility requirements
- Aging infrastructure is more expensive to maintain and operate
- Student safety concern due to proximity to Janesville Road

Master Planning Committee recommends: Closing/selling Muskego Elementary

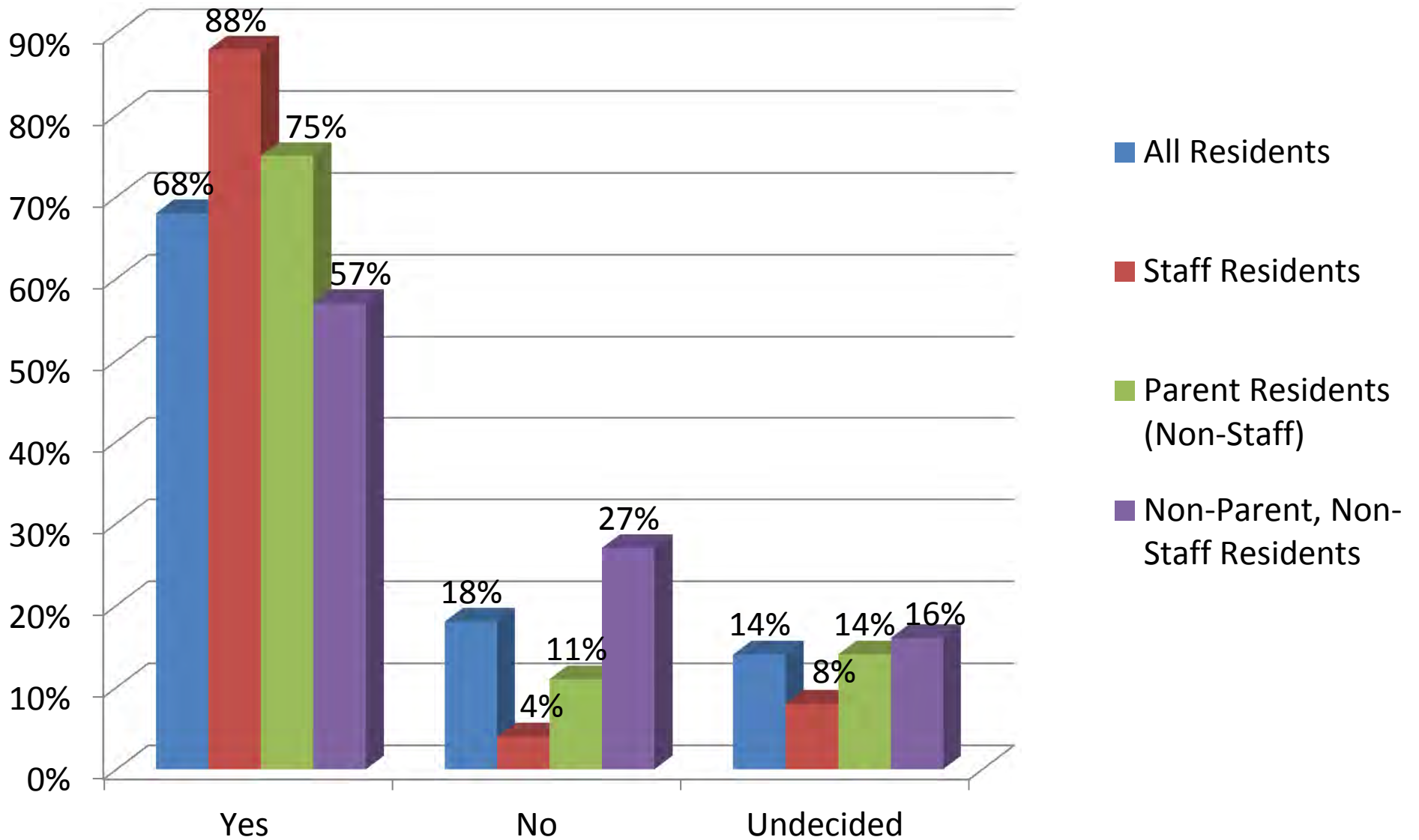
Mill Valley Elementary

- Built in 1925
- Currently serves 310 students in Kindergarten – 4th grade
- Many building components need repair/replacement
- Handicap-accessibility requirements must be addressed
- Site is large enough to accommodate an expansion

Master Planning Committee recommends: Renovating/expanding to serve students in Kindergarten – 4th grade by:

- Adding classrooms, music room, art room and restrooms
- Converting the gym into a dedicated cafeteria
- Building a gym to accommodate Physical Education classes, large group events and community activities
- Demolishing the oldest section of the school and replacing it with a new library and kitchen
- Adding an office, securing the entrance and improving safety
- Replacing the boiler, heating controls and lighting to increase efficiencies
- Replacing ventilators to improve air quality
- Expanding onsite parking

Lakeview Elementary

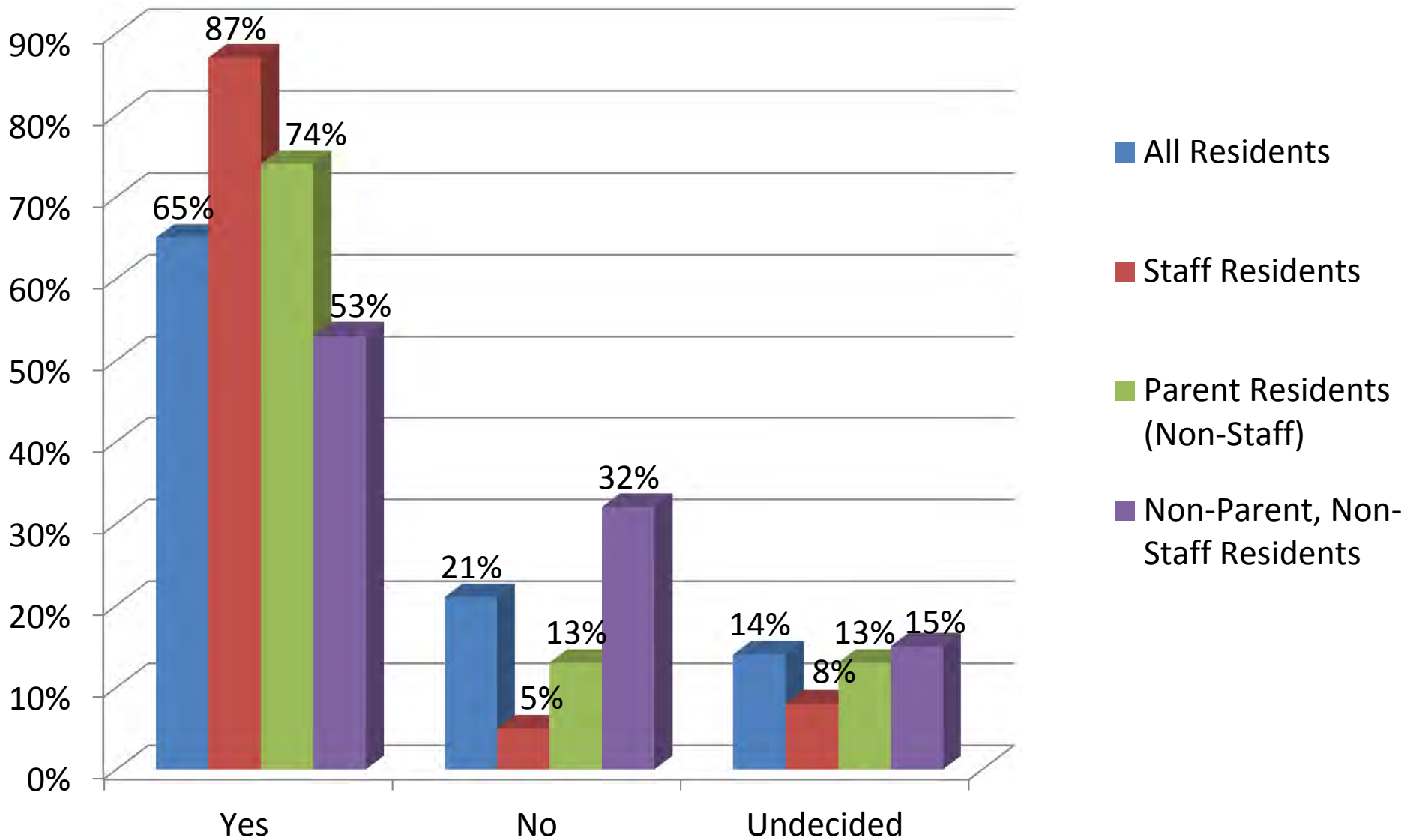
- Built in 1955
- Currently serves 317 students in Kindergarten - 4th grade
- The only elementary school that serves the Town of Norway

Master Planning Committee recommends:

Renovating/expanding to serve students in Kindergarten - 4th grade by:

- Converting the gym into a dedicated cafeteria
- Building a gym to accommodate Physical Education classes, large group events and community activities
- Increasing onsite parking
- Adding air conditioning, replacing ventilators and heating system controls to improve air quality

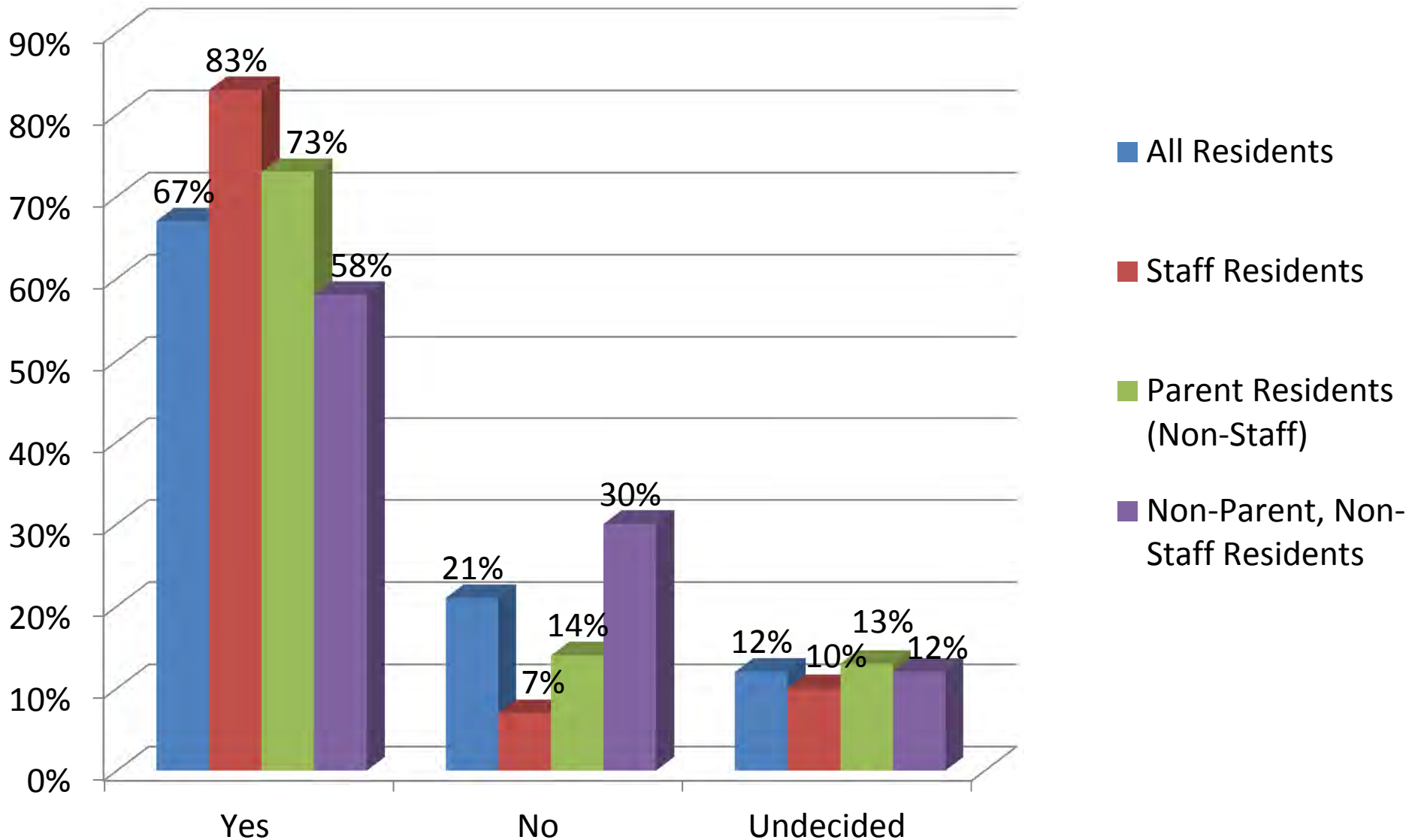
County Meadows Elementary/ Bay Lane Middle School

- Built in 1968
- Currently serves 975 students in Kindergarten – 8th grade in one building:
 - Country Meadows Elementary: 266
 - Bay Lane Middle: 709
- Classroom updates are needed to best meet the instructional needs of students

Master Planning Committee recommends: Renovating the school to serve only elementary students in Kindergarten – 4th grade by:

- Updating classrooms and library space to meet the needs of elementary-age students
- Updating restrooms to meet handicap-accessibility requirements

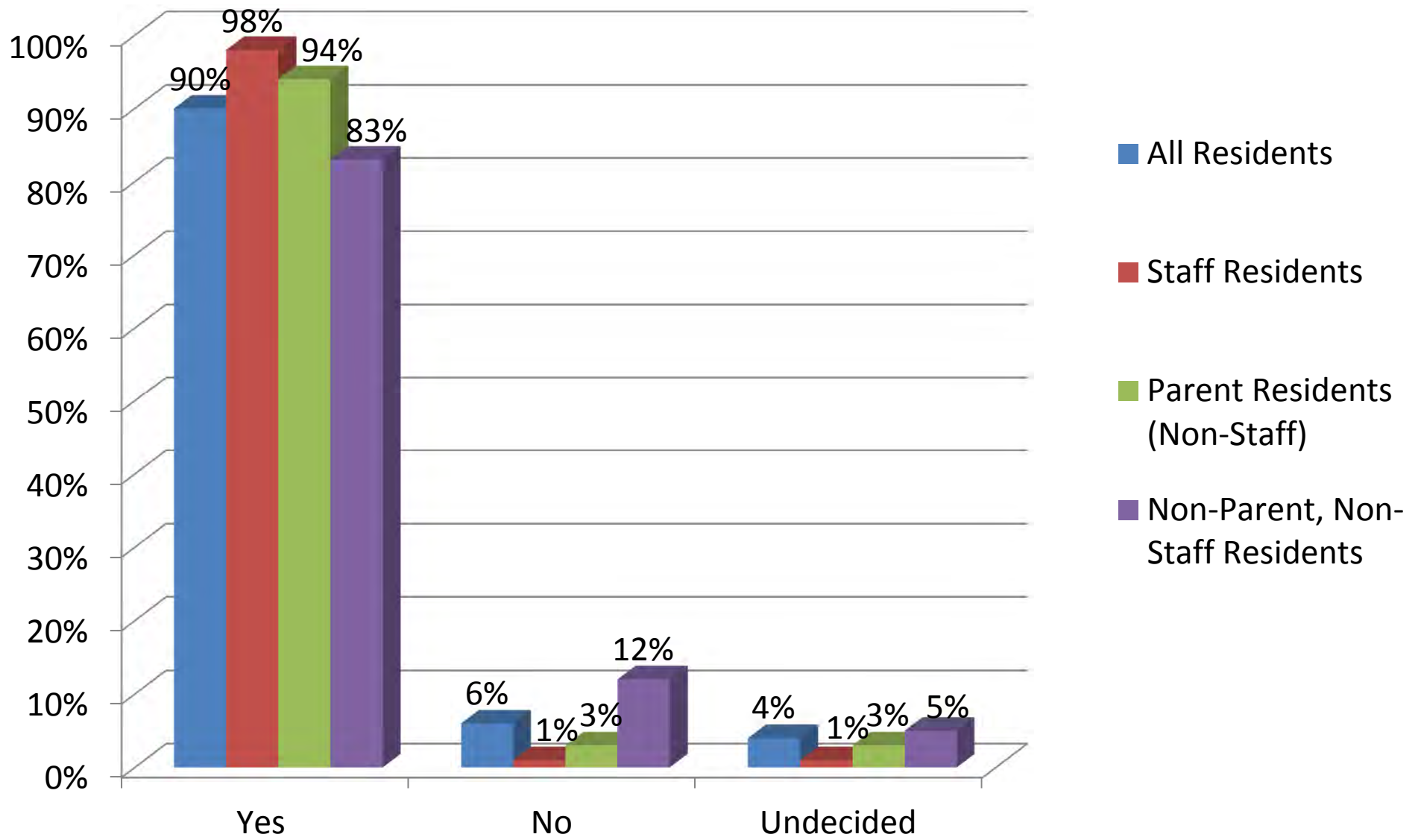


Lake Denoon Middle School

- Built in 1999
- Currently serves 739 students in 5th – 8th grade

Continuing to operate and serve students in 5th
– 8th grade***

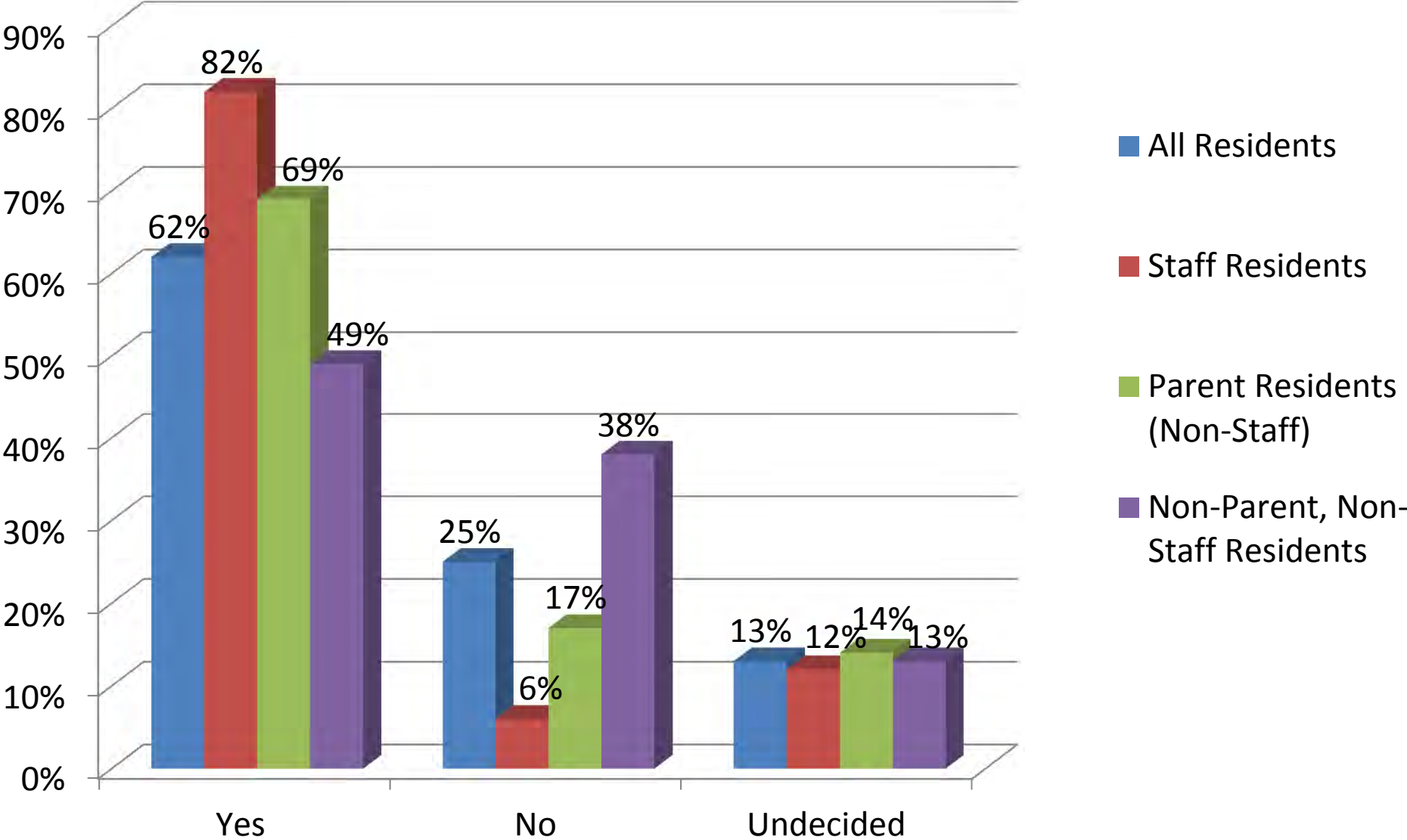
New Middle School

- Due to the conversion of Bay Lane Middle School to an elementary school, a new middle school would be built to serve students in 5th – 8th grade.

Master Planning Committee recommends: Building a new middle school to serve students in 5th – 8th grade on District-owned property on North Cape Road between Mc Shane Drive and Hi View Drive.

- Equipping the building with energy efficient HVAC and lighting systems and access to natural daylight
- Offering a two-station gym to accommodate Physical Education classes, large group events, and community activities
- Providing flexible learning environments to meet the middle school curriculum, including opportunities for hands-on learning in the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) classes

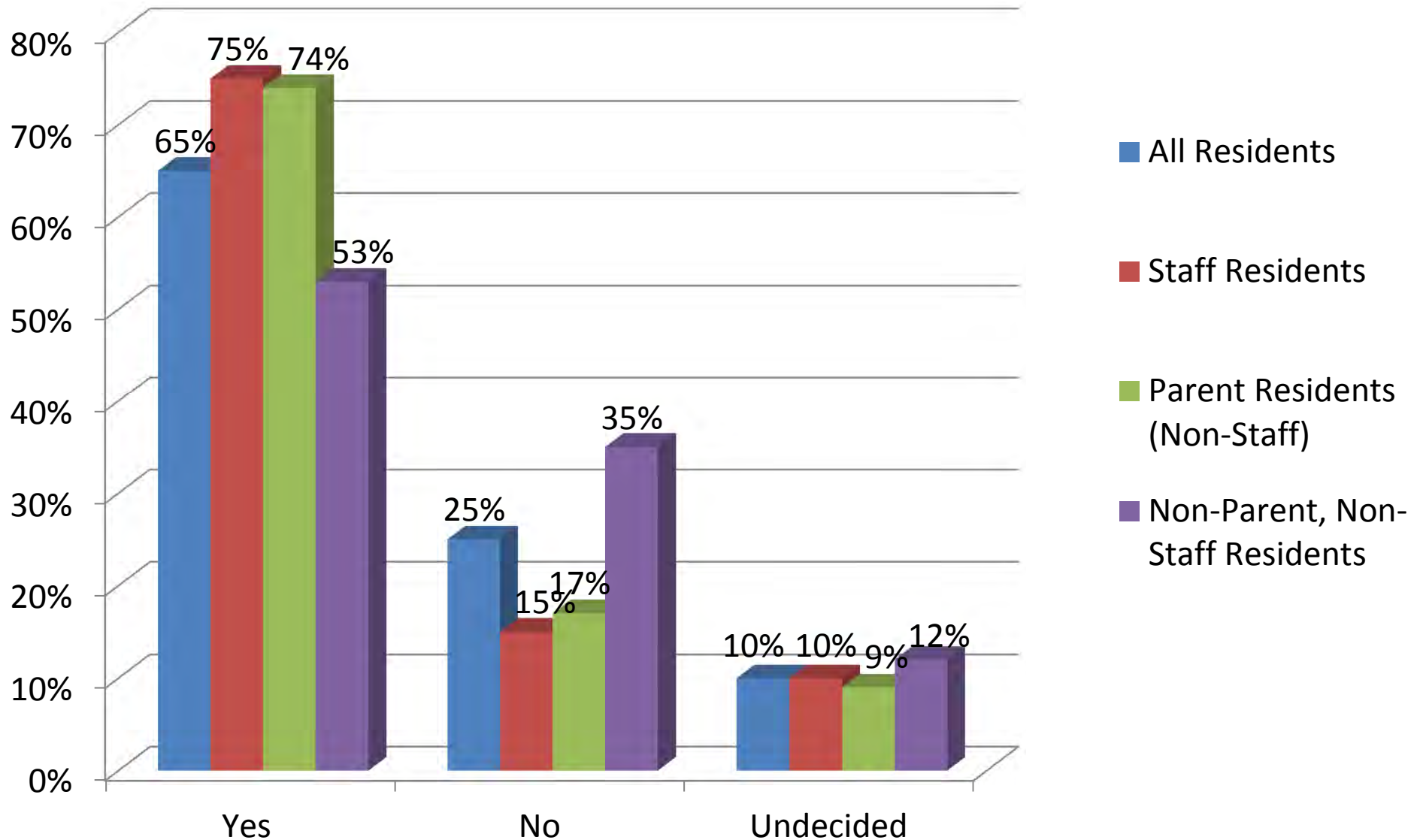
Muskego High School

- Expanded/Renovated in 2003
- Currently serves 1,618 students in 9th – 12th grade

Master Planning Committee recommends:
Continuing to operate and serve students in 9th – 12th grade

- Renovating band/choir/music classrooms to meet expanding program needs
- Updating the Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) classrooms and labs to create more hands-on learning opportunities

Recommended Plan

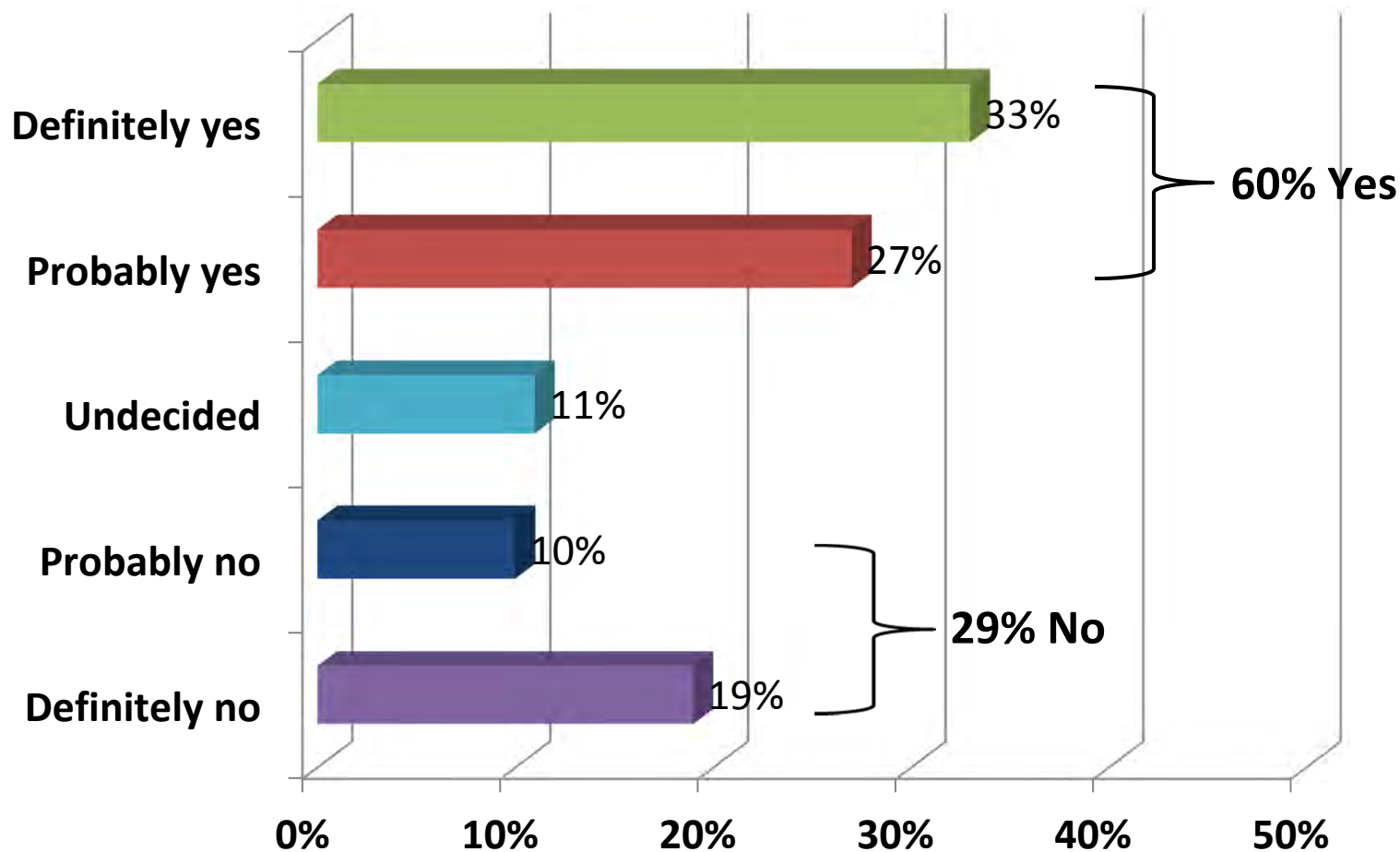
- Mill Valley Elementary - Estimated Cost of \$10.4M
- Lakeview Elementary - Estimated Cost of \$4.6M
- Country Meadows Elementary/Bay Lane Middle - Estimated Cost of \$4.9M
- New Middle School - Estimated Cost of \$34.1
- Muskego High School - Estimated Cost of \$1M

Total Project Cost: \$55 million, increasing the property tax mill rate by \$0.53 per \$1,000 of a home's value.

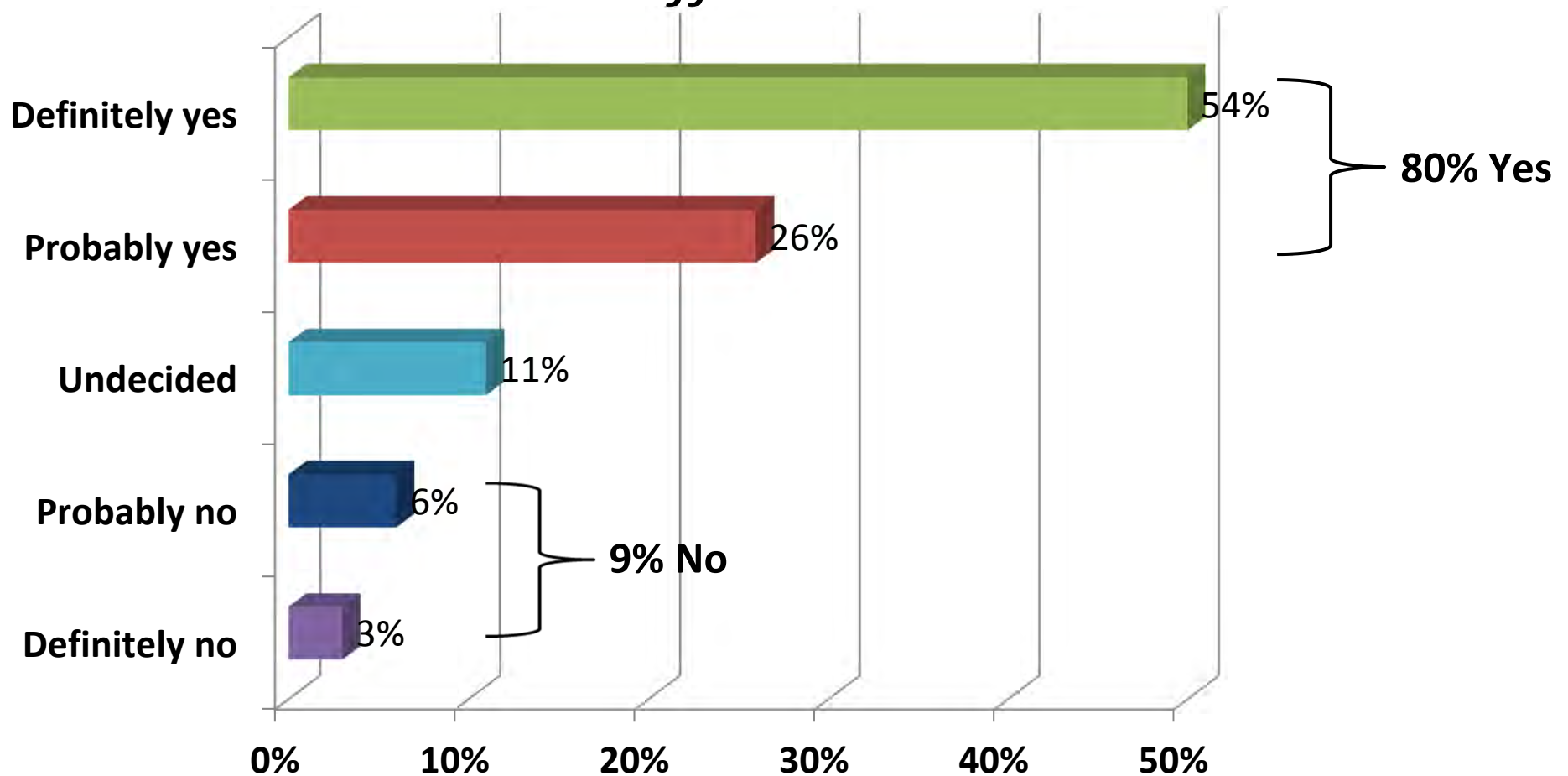

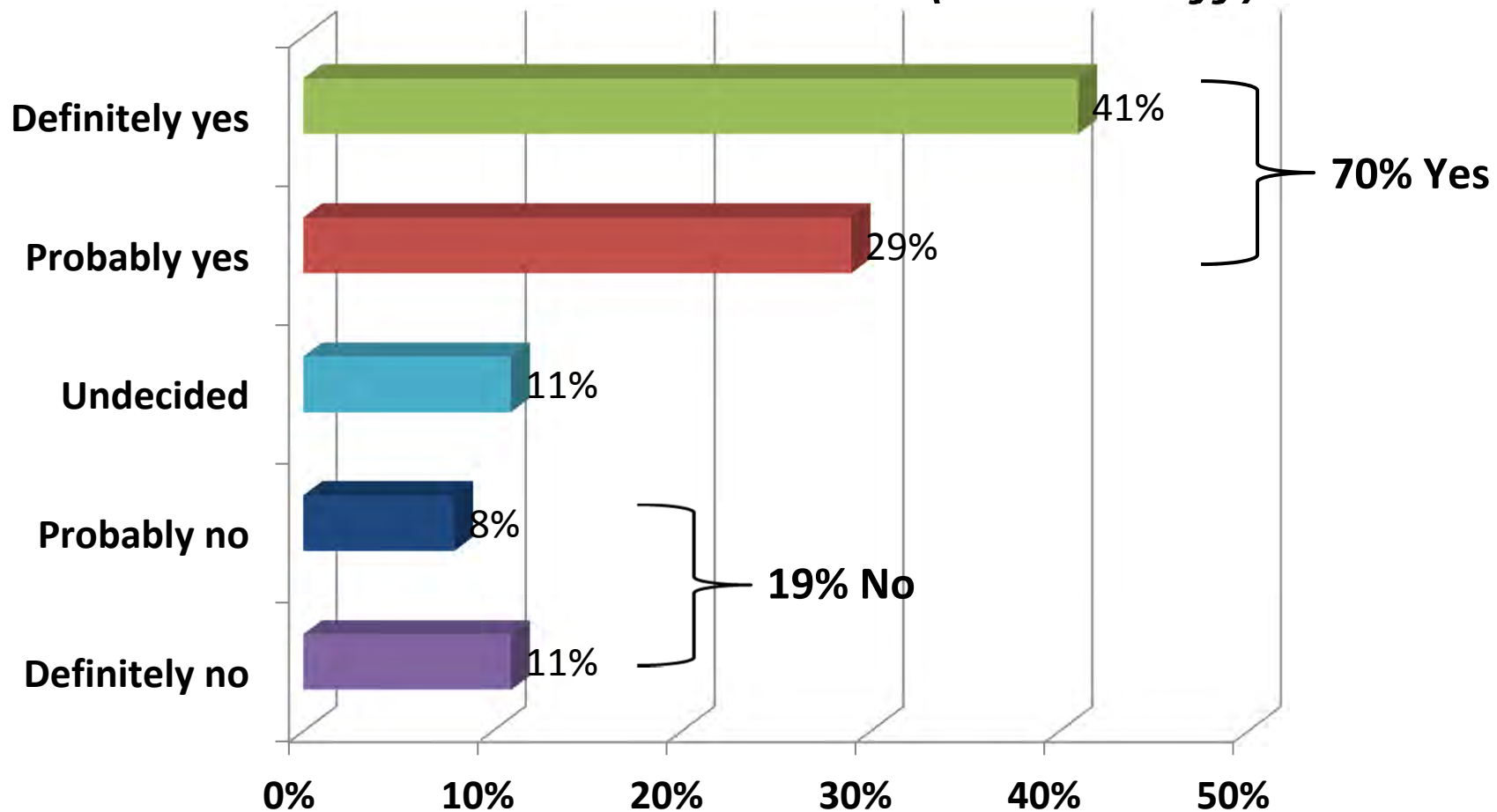

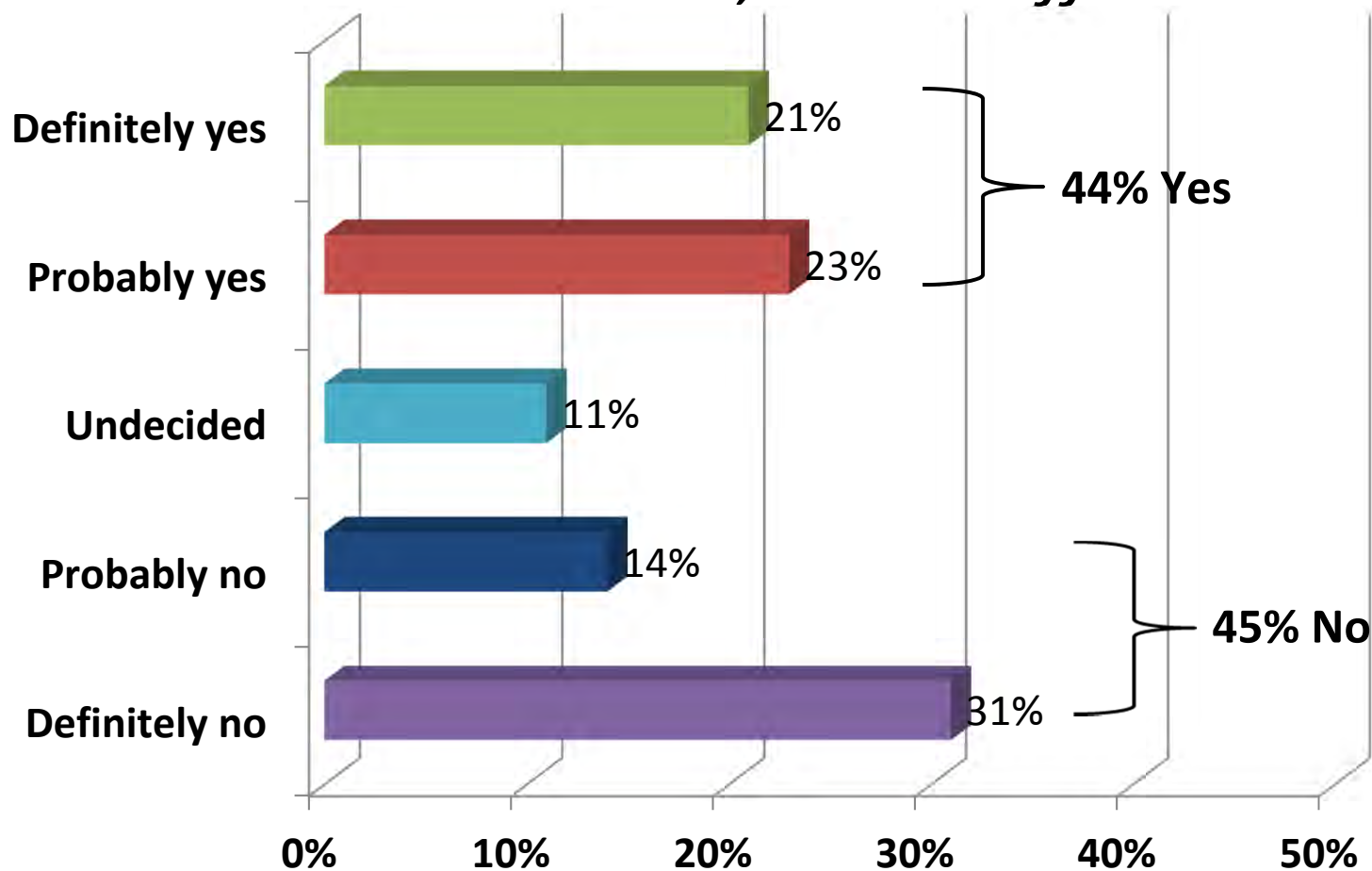

High School Swimming Pool

Master Planning Committee recommends:

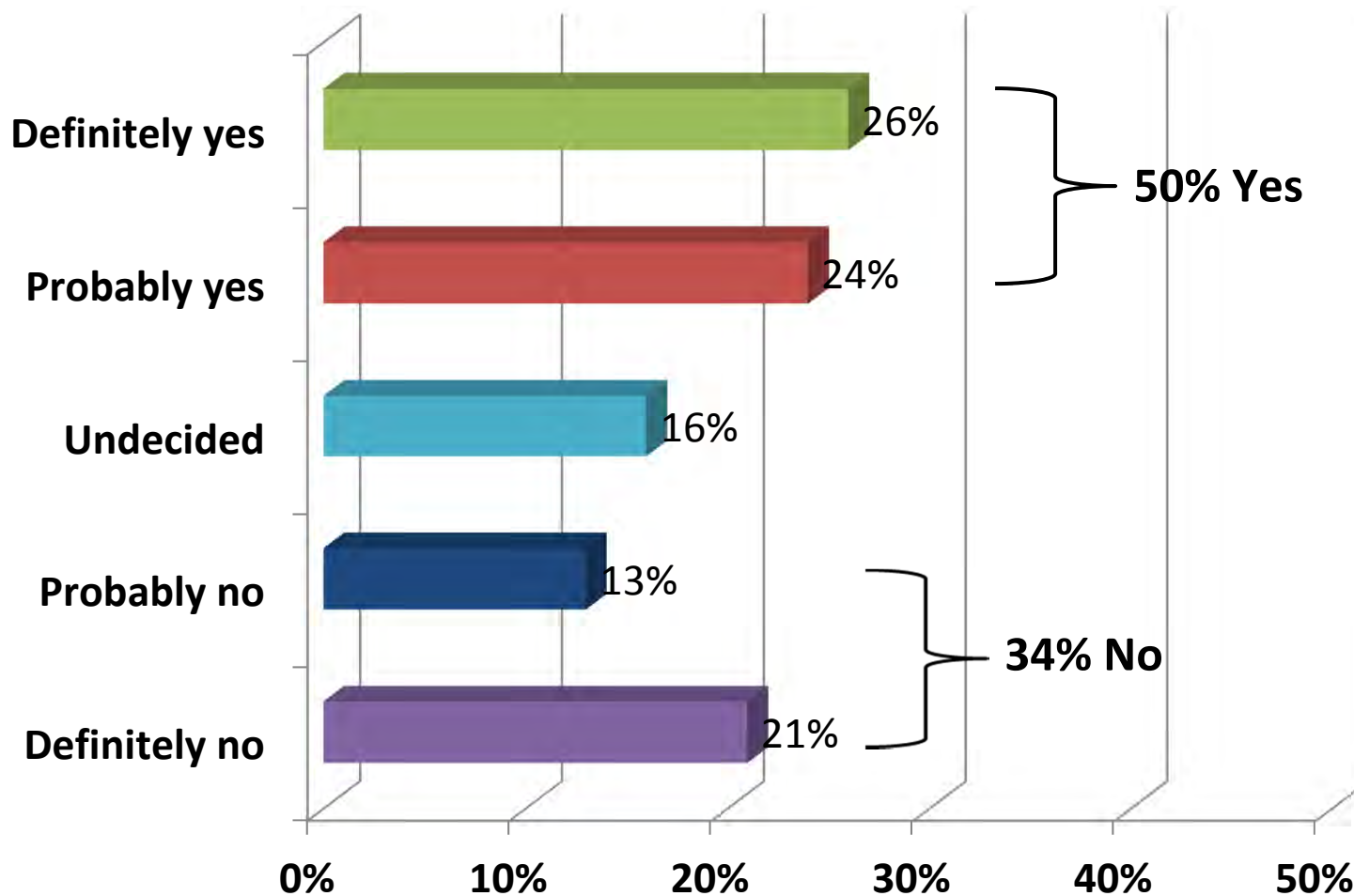
- Replacing with an eight lane pool and diving area
- Replacing pool equipment and mechanical rooms
- Expanding seating capacity for spectators and competitors

Total Project Cost: \$7.5 - \$8.5 million, increasing the property tax mill rate by \$0.24 per \$1,000 of a home's value.

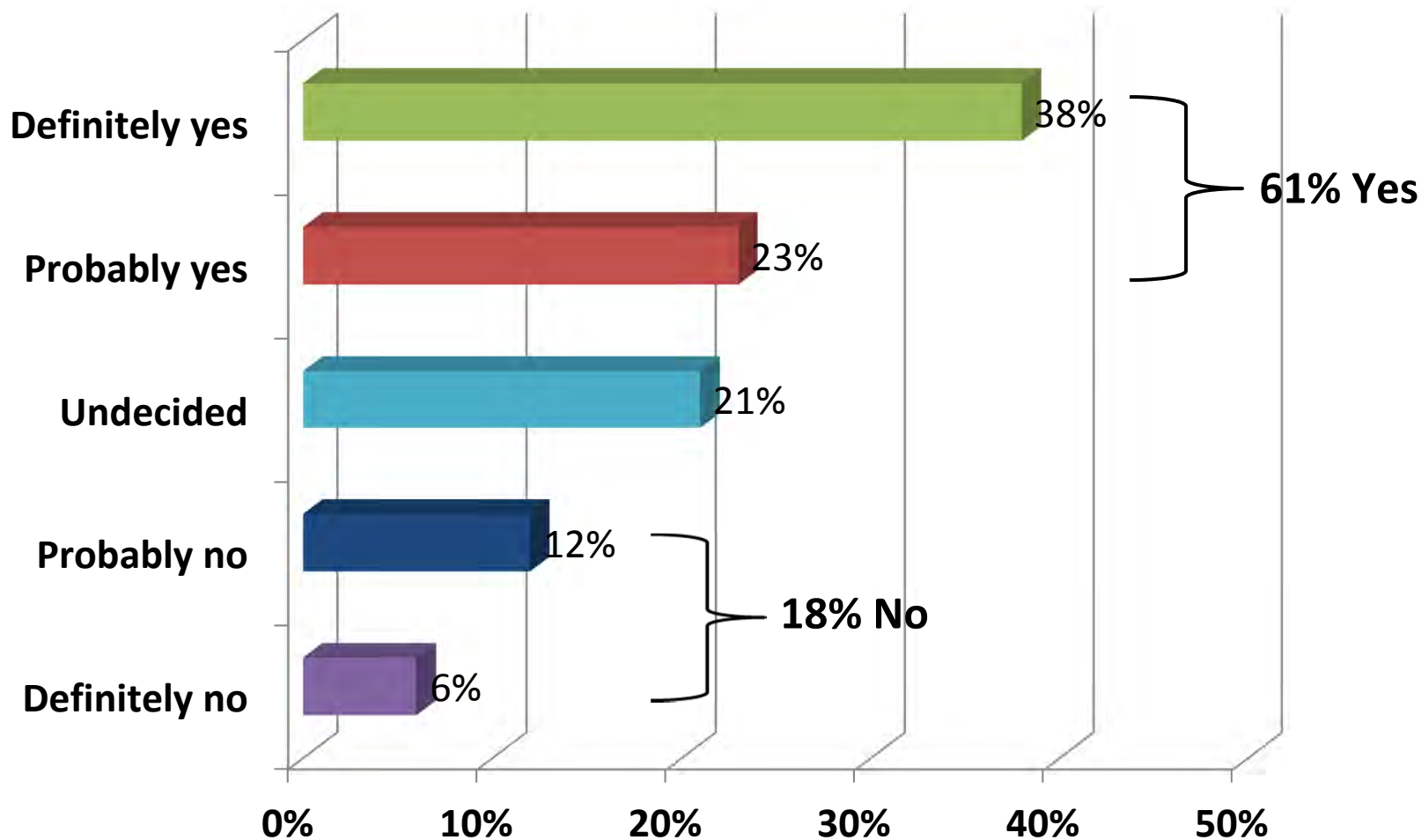

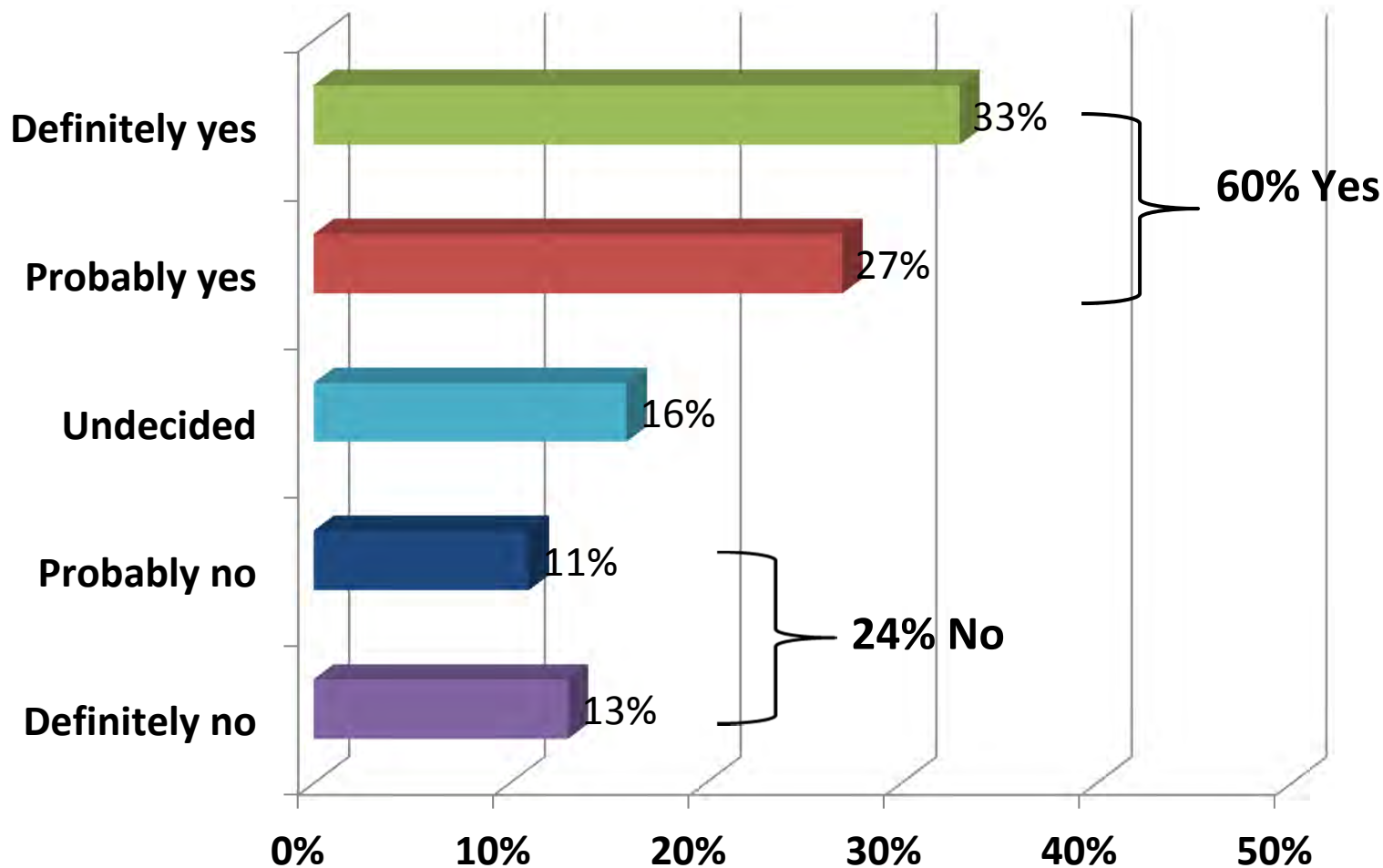

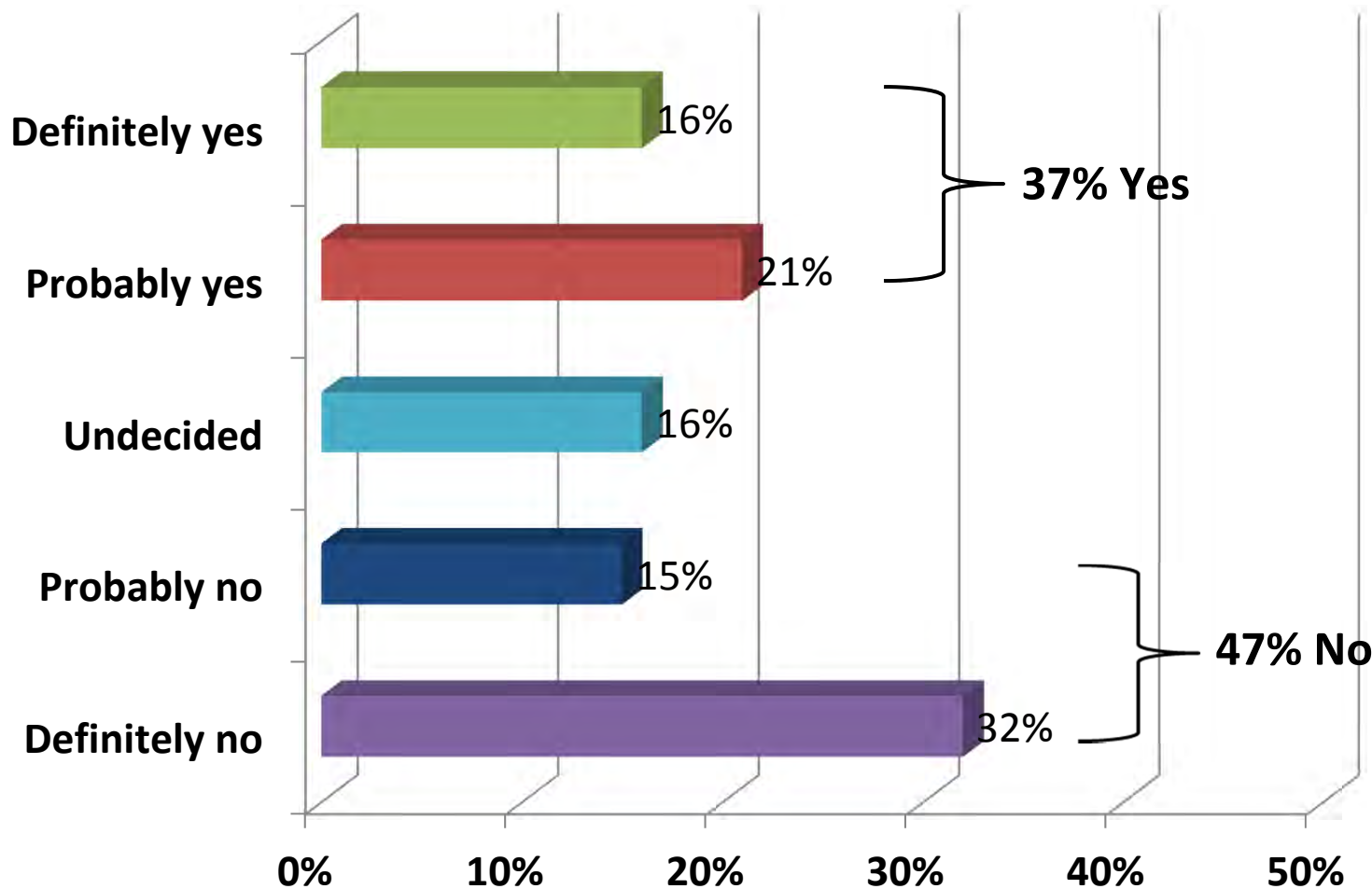

High School Outdoor Athletic Facilities

Master Planning Committee recommends:

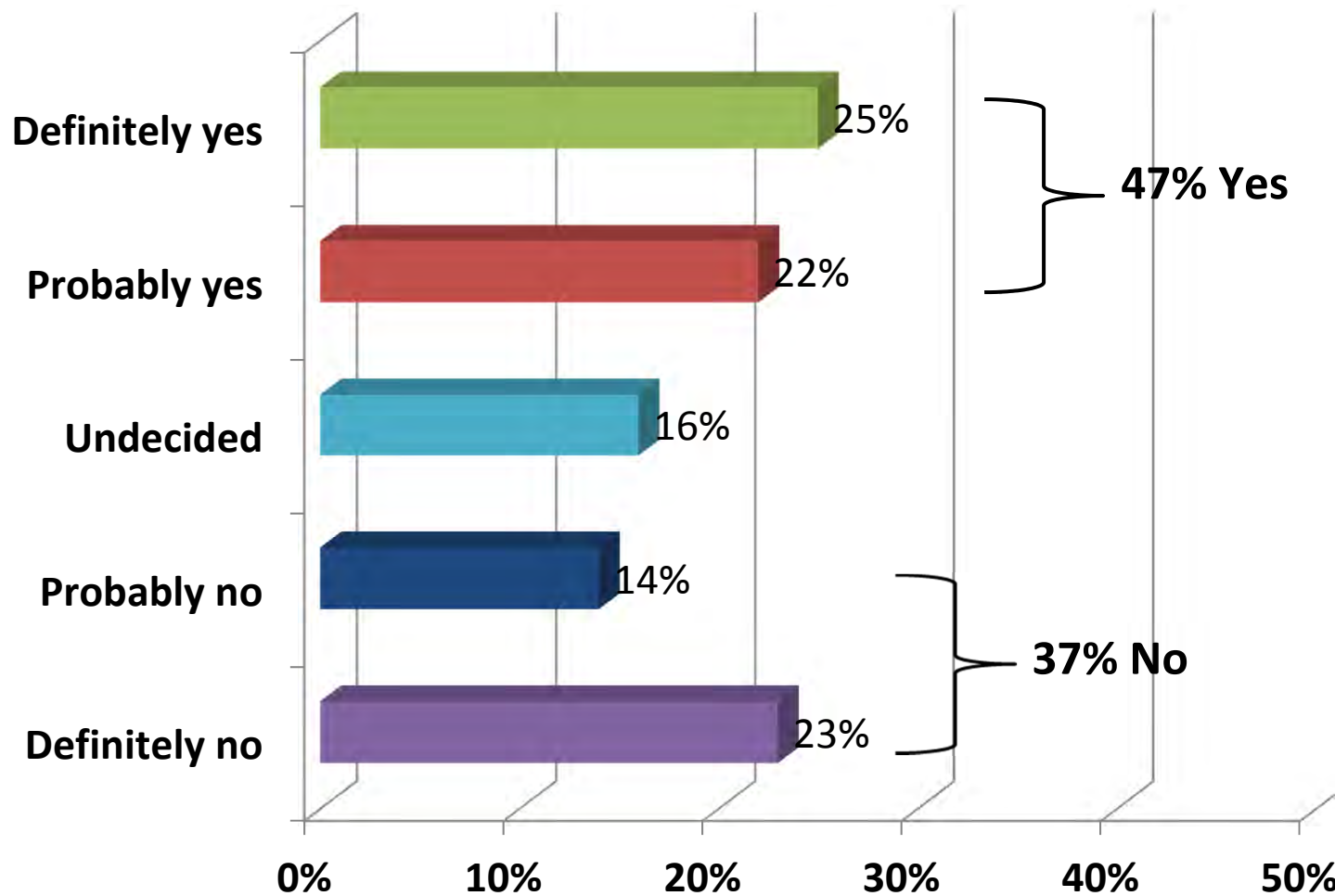
- Adding 2,300 seats to the football stadium bleachers
- Adding artificial turf to the football field, which would be used for Physical Education classes, athletics, band and community-based programs regardless of field conditions
- Building public restrooms, concessions and a ticket booth
- Creating handicap-accessible paths to all athletic fields
- Upgrading fencing and netting at soccer fields
- Improving/increasing seating at the tennis courts
- Resurfacing the tennis courts and track
- Improving softball and baseball fields including scoreboards, dugouts, etc.

Total Project Cost: \$6 million, increasing the property tax mill rate by \$0.18 per \$1,000 of a home's value.

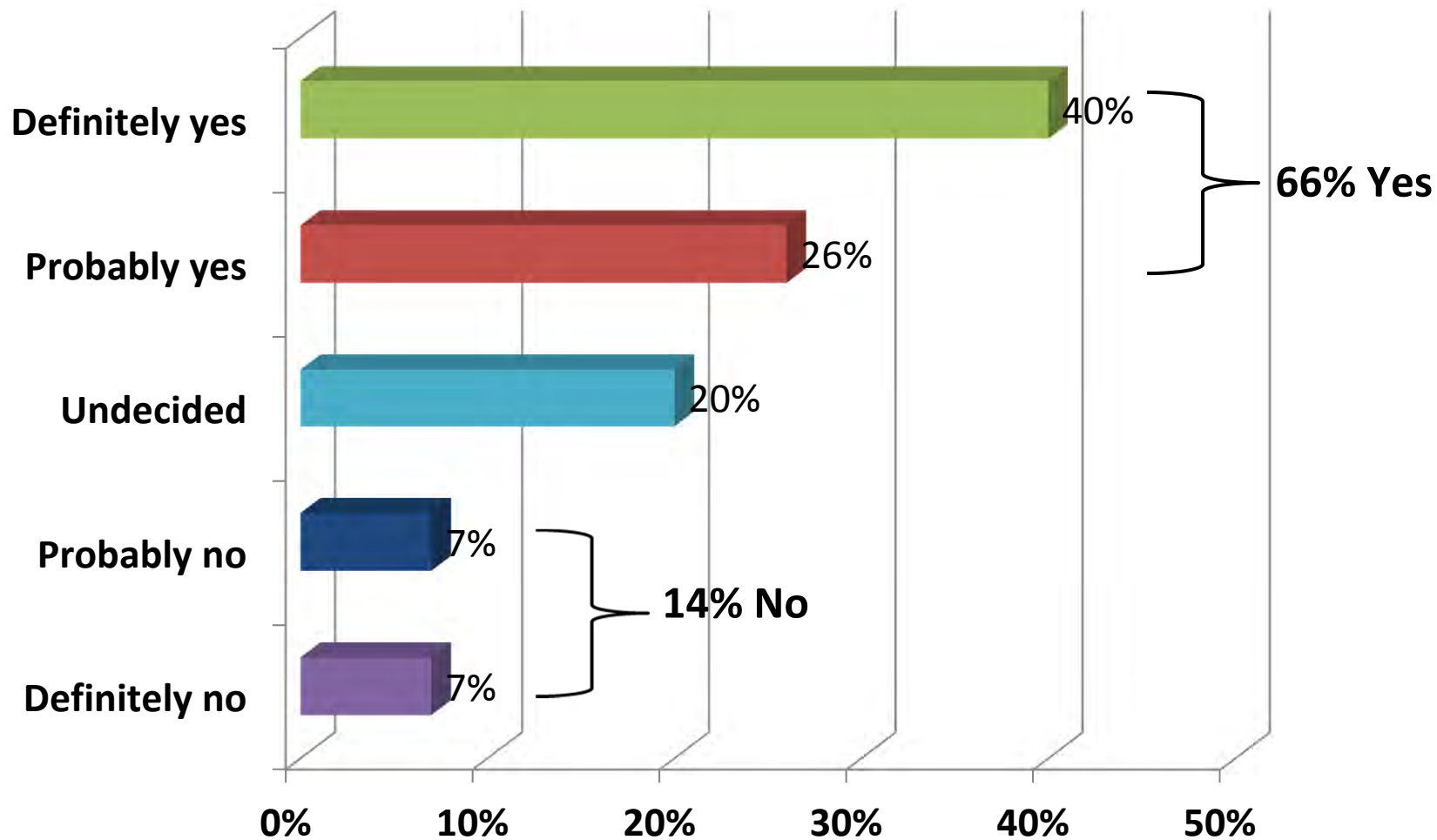

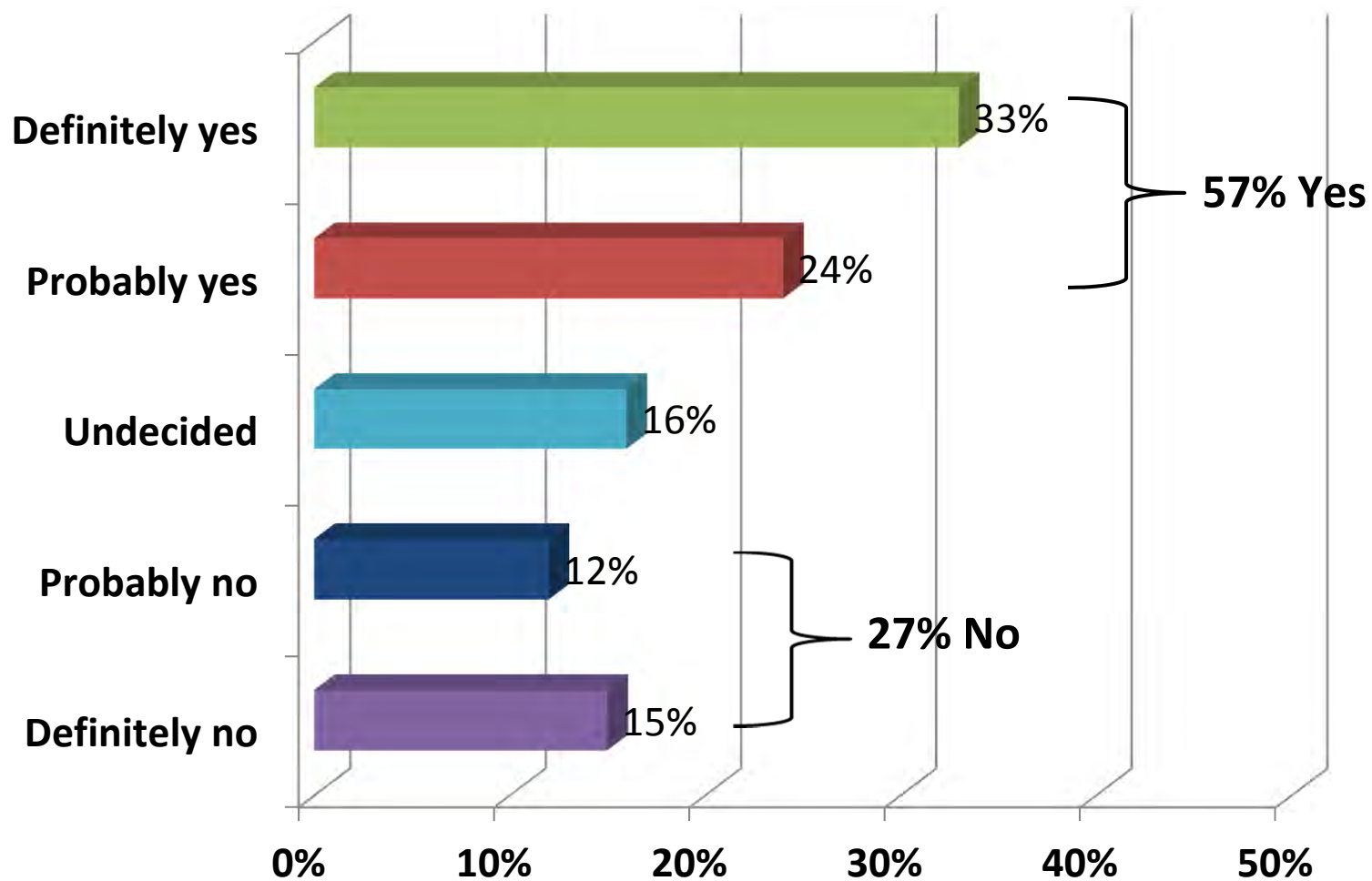

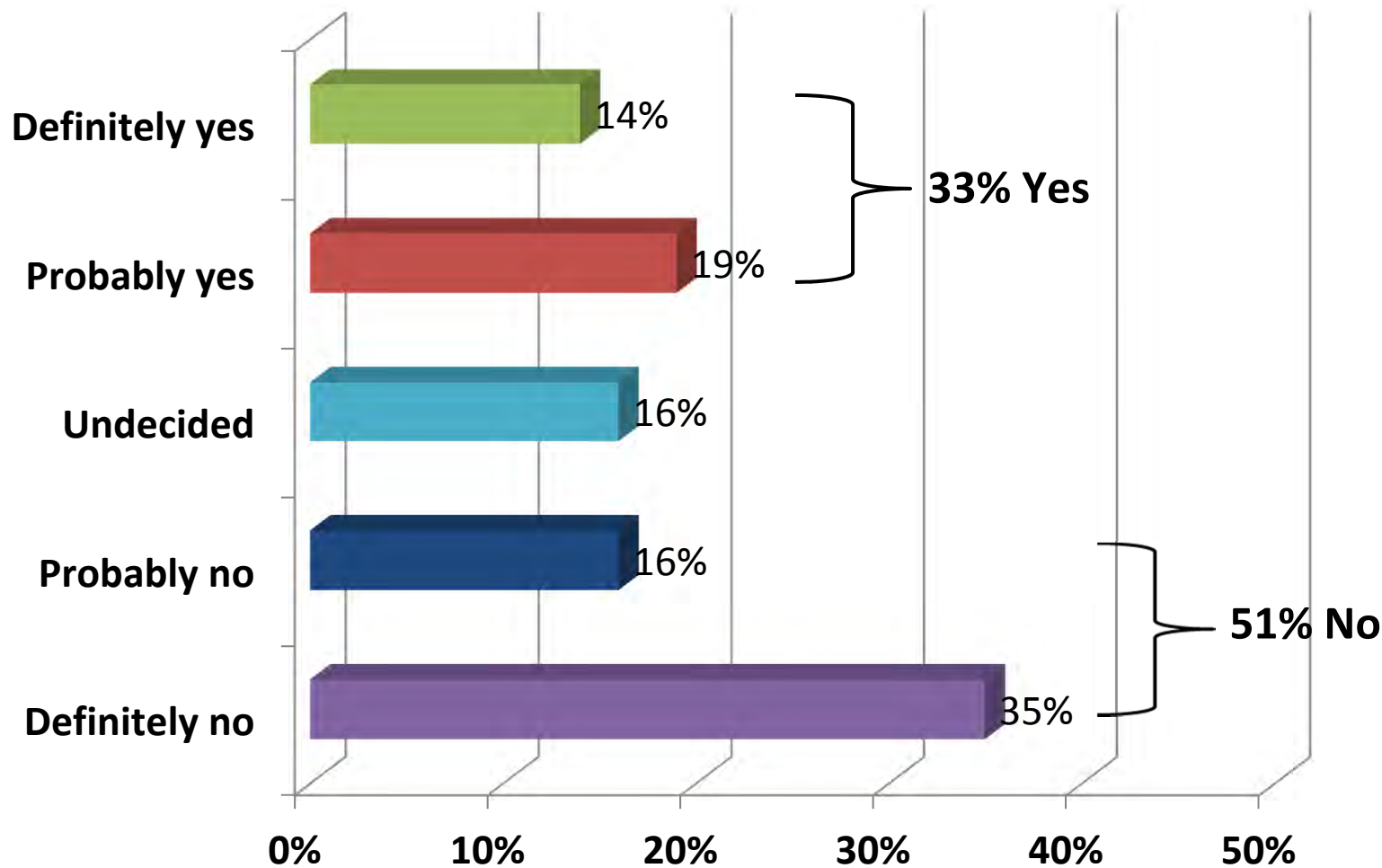
